University of Wisconsin - Madison Arboretum: Has about 7 miles of trails and is not too hilly, with a mix of single track and wide-open trails. 1207 Seminole Hwy, Madison, WI 53711

Black Hawk Unit Trailhead: Has about 11 miles of hilly trails, mix of single track and wide open.

Baxtore's Hollow Trail: It is a 6.7 miles out and back single track and moderately hilly Stones Pocket Rd, North Freedom, WI 53951

Cross Plains State Park and Ice Age Cross Plains segment: Has about 10 miles of trail, definitely hilly, a mix of single track and wide-open trail. 8027 Old Sauk Pass Rd, Cross Plains, WI 53528

Ice Age Cross Plains off Stagecoach road: Has about 4 miles of trail out and back, a mix of open trail and single track with some hills. Stagecoach Rd, Cross Plains, WI 53528

Ice Age Montrose and Brooklyn segments: Is about 12 miles out and back definitely hilly, pretty much all single-track trails.

6688 Frenchtown Rd, Belleville, WI 53508

Ice Age Trail Junction Area Madison / Verona: About 4 miles out and back one way and about 4 miles out and back the other way a little hilly, a mix of single track and wide-open trails.

Ice Age Verona Segment: If you start at M and take the trail south and cross PB it is all single track and about 5 miles out and back with a little loop.

Ice Age Lodi Marsh: It is about 10 miles out and back, definitely hilly, pretty much all single-track trails.

Ice Age Gibraltar Rock: It is about 9 miles out and back really hilly, all single-track trails. If the parking lot is not open, you can start at the South Ferry Terminal Lake Wisconsin Parking lot.

Ice Age Arbor Ridge and Devil's Staircase: Has about 4.5 miles of trail with some hills and a creek crossing, mostly single track and woodsy. 2762 N Co Rd E #2600. Janesville, WI 53548

Ice age Cross Plains and Table Bluff Segments: The Cross Plains is about 4 miles out and back all single track and hilly, the Table Bluff is about 5 miles out and back all single track and hilly. There are about 1.5 miles of road between them if you wanted to connect them.

Ice Age Southern Kettle Unit: It is about 32 miles of connecting trails from point to point, definitely hilly.

Nordic Skiing and Hiking Trails / John Hiking-Biking Trails: If you combine the two trails' systems you can get about 20 to 30 miles of trail that also links up to the Ice Age Trail. Definitely hilly with a mix of single track and wide-open trails. *N9084 Co Rd H, Whitewater, WI 53190*

Parfrey's Glen State Natural Area: This Segment links into Devil's Lake ice age loop and is mostly single track and definitely hilly. 1377 County Rd DL, Merrimac, WI 53561

Ice Age Merrimac Segment: Is a 7 mile from point to point that is single track, hilly and leads into the Devil's Lake ice age loop. *Ice Age National Scenic Trail, S7162 Marsh Rd, Merrimac, WI 53561*

Glacial Drumlin Trail: It is 52 miles from point to point starting in Cottage Grove and ending in Waukesha, flat and wide-open trail.

Badger State Trail: It is 40 miles from point to point starting in Fitchburg and ending at the Wisconsin and Illinois border, flat and wide-open trail. If you start at the Oregon parking lot and go left it is all trail if you go right, it is 6 miles of pavement. It also links up to the Ice Age Montrose segment.

Military Ridge State Trail: It is 40 miles from point to point, it starts in Dodgeville and ends in Verona. It is a flat and wide-open trail with a little asphalt stretch.

Sugar River Trail: The Sugar River State Trail follows an abandoned railroad line in south central Wisconsin for 24 miles from New Glarus to Brodhead.
