

Programs + Services

Goodwill is a nonprofit organization that serves the Greater Kansas City community and surrounding areas. All programs and services are available to job seekers at no cost and are developed to overcome each individual's specific barriers to employment.

Employment Services offer one-on-one career support to individuals with barriers to employment who are interested in achieving career success. We assist with career exploration, skills and interest assessments, essential skills training, resume building, mock interviews, job search and application, wraparound services, and case management.

Digital Skills Training classes are offered in person at Goodwill's Mission Support Center in Kansas City and off-site in our Mobile Workforce Unit. Training includes basic computer skills, internet basics, and social media. Additional software training is available for Windows 10, MacOS, Google Drive, and various Microsoft programs. Goodwill also offers digital navigation services to support individuals in accessing devices and the internet. To request an appearance by our Mobile Workforce Unit, visit mokangoodwill.org.

Reentry Services offer one-on-one career support to individuals who have legal history and/or are currently involved with the criminal justice system. Job seekers meet regularly with Workforce Development Specialists who provide support in overcoming barriers and obtaining employment, including accessing occupational training credentials.

Through the **Federal AbilityOne Program**, Goodwill provides custodial service at the Richard Bolling Federal Building in downtown Kansas City, MO, and Fort Leavenworth, KS. These jobs provide people with significant documented disabilities the opportunity to acquire job skills and training, receive good wages and benefits, and gain greater independence.

The Goodwill Artemis Institute:

- The Bridge to Technology course offers the opportunity for adult learners to explore careers within tech driven work. Cohorts engage in digital skills training and academic preparation, and receive an introduction to the 4th Industrial Revolution, 21st century critical thinking, and technology careers.
- The Certified Manufacturing Associate program is a 3-week course designed to quickly provide an industry recognized credential (IRC), hands-on experience, and direct access to employers so individuals are prepared for an entry-level manufacturing role.
- Goodwill partners with corporate leaders and online learning management tools to cover the cost of available industry recognized credentials including Meta Social Media Marketing Professional Certificate, IBM SkillsBuild badges, Grow with Google IT Support, Data Analytics, Project Management, UX Design, Cyber Security, and IT Automation with Python Certificates.


