Full house, full hearts.

In 2010, we bumped up against the limits of our facility. Operating at 95% occupancy, we housed 1,155 patients and/or their families; but, we referred an additional 2,118 to local hotels—our essential partners with whom we negotiate deep discounts for the benefit of families in crisis. Limited office and storage space necessitated our making significant leasehold improvements in just our third year.

As a result, the Board of Directors has established an Expansion Feasibility Committee to explore the possibility of: 1) adding as many as 38 bedrooms; 2) incorporating additional office and storage space; and 3) expanding the kitchen and dining area. If the current site allows for this scope of expansion, we will

> then study the feasibility of successfully completing a capital campaign to make it happen.

On March 31, 2011, SECU Family House at UNC Hospitals celebrated its third anniversary. In three years, we have housed more than 3,000 patients and/or family members and caregivers from 99 NC counties, 32 other states and 5 foreign countries and provided in excess of 67,000 guest stays.

Our sense of urgency is driven by what we hear from our guests about the value of the services we provide. The feedback we get—on our guest satisfaction survey, in personal notes and anecdotal comments—is, with rare exception, wildly positive. On the

written survey, our guests rate SECU Family House as "great" (4 on a scale of 4) in the following categories, according to the following percentages:

- ➤ price/value (88%)
- ➤ cleanliness of room/facility (90%)
- ➤ buildings and grounds (96%)
- ➤ kitchen/dining facilities (91%)
- ➤ proximity to the hospital (94%)
- ➤ hospitality (100%)
- ➤ professionalism of staff (96%)
- ➤ check-in/check-out process (89%)

In an attempt to quantify the emotional and psychological benefits of staying at Family House, we added a new section to our guest survey (please see the accompanying bar graph). The House's creature comforts are readily transparent. However, the nurture and psychological support that our volunteers and staff provide—along with the benefits of having an exquisitely beautiful and welcoming facility—combine to create the ineffable quality that this House holds for so many families who now simply know it as home.

We continue to be immensely grateful for your gifts of time, funds, materials, and moral and emotional encouragement. May the personal health, wholeness, and happiness that you would confer on others continue to animate your days and nights.

- ➤ In 2010, we operated at 95% occupancy and served 1,155 patients or patients' family members.
- ➤ We provided 27,082 stays to patients/patient families from 88 of NC's 100 counties, 21 other states and 3 foreign countries.
- ➤ Eighty-nine% of our guests came from North Carolina.
- ➤ The average stay for guests was 6.7 nights.
- ➤ Excluding depreciation, our operating cost per room per night was \$58.61.
- ➤ The average contribution from our guests per room per night was \$23.00.
- ➤ We arranged for deeply discounted hotel stays for another 2,118 patients/patient families, providing an additional 5,048 nights of lodging for families in medical crisis.
