# Blood Bankers, Blood and Current Events

Newtown, Columbine, Aurora, Boston and now Orlando are cities that are instantly recognized by everyone in the world – and not just as great tourist locations. The notoriety that has befallen these cities was unwanted, and has come with tremendous sadness and grief. It is disturbing that these tragedies seem to be increasing in frequency.

Recently in NC, outside a Mosque in Raeford, a man was arrested and charged with the following: ethnic intimidation, assault with a deadly weapon, going armed to terrorize the public, communicating threats, stalking, and disorderly conduct. Although he had several firearms, ammunition, and a number of additional weapons located inside his SUV, he did not physically harm anyone.

It brought to my mind that Massive Transfusion Protocols could be required and activated anywhere, in any transfusion service. On social media, a blood banker from Orlando reported that they signed out almost 500 units of blood the night of the nightclub massacre. In AABB SmartBrief, it was reported that 372 units were transfused. Donors lined up to donate blood the next day. If ever you questioned the value of our profession, this one report should convince you that transfusion services and blood bankers are essential personnel in tragic, national-attention events.

At the NCABB fall meeting, we will hear Dr. Poisson from Duke discuss their development of massive transfusion protocols for multiple situations. A most amazing massive transfusion case study of a post-partum hemorrhage will be presented by Christi Marshall from John's Hopkins. An astonishing photo of the used blood bags from that massive transfusion case can be seen in January's Transfusion magazine.

We like to think that a tragedy will not affect our city or our transfusion service, but recent NC news brings that assumption into question. Being prepared is characteristic of Clinical Laboratory Scientists. Plan to attend the fall meeting in Wilmington. Learn from the experts.
