The meeting topics included: **platelet pathogen reduction**, **hemovigilance**, **investigation of benign and clinically significant antibodies to high frequency antigens** as well as case study sessions on **transfusion reaction reporting**, **molecular RBC typing** and **ABO incompatible transplantations**. # Awards at the Fall Meeting



Petteway-Shepherd Recipient, Dr. Joann M. Moulds

The NCABB **Petteway-Shepherd Award** recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions to the field of transfusion medicine and whose prominence is well established nationally. Each year, at the fall meeting, the NCABB honors one individual with this award.

The 2017 Petteway-Shepherd Award recipient is **Joann M. Moulds** PhD, MT(ASCP)SBB. Recently retired Scientific Director of Grifols' new Immunohematology Center, Dr. Moulds has a distinguished career history in the blood bank community. She has published approximately 200 manuscripts, abstracts and review articles and edited several books. She has served as the AABB Chairman of the Molecular Testing Standards Program Unit and the AABB liaison to the Clinical Laboratory Standards Institute. She is also the recipient of various national and state awards recognizing her contributions. At the 2017 fall NCABB meeting, Dr. Moulds could not appear in person due to hurricane weather conditions, however she provided an informative recorded lecture for the attendees on the topic of "From Test Tubes to Transfusion: When is an Antibody Clinically Significant".

The Frances K. Widmann Service Award honors those members who have given generously of their time and energy in support of NCABB and its mission. The award is named in honor of Dr. Frances Widmann, an original member of NCABB, whose life's work reflected the mission of association. At the 2017 fall meeting, Malú Anderson was presented with the award for her many years of dedicated service to the NCABB.
