Arts Academy at Estrella Mountain Families:

Governor Ducey in recent executive orders has prescribed that all school districts should provide a safe space for students to do their distance learning beginning on August 17, 2020. The Arts Academy at Estrella Mountain will provide this option to registered students. The purpose of this program is to provide students a safe place to do their distance learning. All district teaching and learning will still be done remotely. There will *not* be any inperson lessons delivered, and teachers will not be available on campus.

- Safe Learning Space hours will be from 8:00AM until 3:00PM (Monday-Friday)
- Students will need to check-in at the start of each day to ensure that necessary materials are in the student's possession (e.g. mask, Chromebook, charger, water bottle, and headphones, etc.).
- Health Screenings may be conducted. MASKS ARE REQUIRED TO BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.
- Unscheduled drop-in days are strongly discouraged. Staffing levels and student lunch availability will be based on the number of students who are signed up in advance.
- Students will be provided a socially distanced work space where they will be supervised by classified staff (not teachers). Students will connect with their teachers virtually to do their remote learning.
- **Teachers will not be present to provide academic support.** (Teachers will be instructing their classes virtually.)
- Students are required to bring all needed learning materials to campus so they are able to participate with their remote sessions.
- Students will be expected to adhere to behavioral expectations in order to participate. Students refusing to wear masks will be sent home. Students NOT logging in and engaging in class will be sent home. Student dress code will be enforced. Please see the Student Code of Conduct for more details.
- Safe Learning Space is not child care. This is a supervised safe space.
- Staff may provide technical assistance (login, navigation, etc.) and help clarify questions. **Tutoring, and other academic support will not be available**.
- Breakfast and lunch will be available, or students may bring their own sack lunch. Students will eat at their work space.
- Local, state and national health agency recommendations are in place including hand sanitizing, social distancing, and face masks.
- Families will be asked to sign a PLC Charter Schools Acknowledgement of Risk form. Link to the form is at the bottom of the page. Please sign it and return to the school with your student.
- Consistent with the Governor's Executive Order, a maximum capacity will be set in order to mitigate the potential spread of COVID-19. This means that it is possible that not every registered student will be able to start on August 17.
