NC Counts Coalition has partnered with the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services' Division of Child and Family Wellbeing to address the behavioral health needs of Black Indigenous People of Color (BIPOC) and lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and/or questioning (LGBTQ+) children/students in grades K-12 affected by COVID-19. Through this partnership, we are working with community-based organizations (CBOs) throughout the state) to deliver community outreach that will help us better understand the behavioral health needs of BIPOC and LGBTQ+ students in grades K-12 in communities throughout North Carolina.
