All public school teachers and support personnel in grades Pre-K through 12 are eligible to apply for grants up to \$350.00 for special classroom projects or enrichment programs.

HOW TO APPLY: Carefully review this proposal form and guidelines below before writing a project proposal. A typed copy of each proposal must be postmarked by Tuesday, October 25, 2011.

Project awards will be announced by November 29, 2011, and checks will be sent directly to project teachers. Projects are to be implemented between February 2012 and June 2012, and final evaluations submitted to the Education Fund Committee by August 2, 2012.

<u>**THE SELECTION PROCESS</u>**: Applications are evaluated anonymously by a Review Committee of Board members from the Franklin County Community Foundation.</u>

The committee considers four factors in evaluating proposals: creativity, benefit to students, efficient use of funds, and adaptability of project. An important consideration is to make the project as cost-effective as possible, because funds are limited.

<u>GUIDELINES</u>: The following guidelines should be used in considering applications for a minigrant:

Projects should directly involve students as much as possible. An audiovisual program developed for classroom use, for example, ideally should be written and produced by students.

Funds can be used to purchase equipment or to provide field trip transportation, but not when they are detached from a larger project. Equipment and trips should be just one component of a well-planned unit of instruction.

Incorporating matching funds and community resources is encouraged. For example, donations of community organizations could be used as a component of project support.

Interdisciplinary or team-teaching projects and those that involve different age groups are accepted.

Portions of grants can be used to compensate experts who come to work with students but not to pay public school teachers or staff.

Submit to the address listed above a written evaluation of the project, a simple financial statement, and receipts for expenses within two weeks of completion of the project, but in any event no later than August 2, 2012, whichever is first. Any remaining funds must be returned upon receipt of financial statement.
