She previously worked in a similar position as a regional associate with NCCF. Titles were expanded to more aptly reflect the scope and depth of this position's duties, Migliore said. "In the capacity of facilitating board leadership in the coastal plain north region, Lee develops and supports the boards' work to grow philanthropy, build endowments and administer local grantmaking in their counties," she said. NCCF has eight regional directors who oversee affiliate activities in regions that directly serve 67 counties in the state.

Lee is founding member of the Women Givers of Nash-Rocky Mount, a committee member of the Healthy Kids Collaborative of the Down East Partnership for Children and an avid supporter and volunteer for Special Olympics. She holds a Certificate in Nonprofit Management from Duke University and special certifications in event planning, small group facilitation and nonprofit marketing. She is pursuing a bachelor's degree in leadership in the public sector from NC State University and is a graduate of Nash Community College.

NCCF CEO Jennifer Tolle Whiteside noted that these positions are key to the organization's mission to ensure that philanthropy is available throughout the state, with a focus on rural areas. "Without the position of regional director, we could not carry out our work across the state," she said.
