Wake County; and WAMY Community Action of Boone.

The grants committee of the statewide Women's Fund is comprised of representatives of the NCCF's local women's giving circles and other female community

leaders from across North Carolina. The NCCF supports eight regionally based giving programs across the state, including the Bertie-Hertford Women's Fund; Women Givers of Northeast North Carolina (Camden, Gates, Pasquotank and Perquimans counties); the Women Givers of Currituck-Dare; the Wake County Women's Giving Network; the Art of Giving, a collective of Triangle women; Women Givers of Nash-Rocky Mount; the Onslow Women's Health Fund; and a new group just emerging in the Catawba Valley area.
