Duke Energy Invests \$6.7 million in NC Community College Grants

RALEIGH, N.C. – Duke Energy and the North Carolina Community College System today announced the expansion of the Duke Energy Community College Grant Program through a \$6.7 million investment from Duke Energy Foundation.

The funds are available to community colleges throughout the state to further NC Community Colleges' focus on technical education and support of business and industry.

Since 2004, Duke Energy has awarded \$15 million in grants to 24 community colleges within the Duke Energy Carolinas service area. This new \$6.7 million investment also includes community colleges located in the Duke Energy Progress service area.

Individual community colleges can apply for funds through the Foundation for the Carolinas (Duke Energy Carolinas customers) or NC Community Foundation (Duke Energy Progress customers). Applications will be reviewed by a committee of representatives from Duke Energy, NC Community College System and NC Department of Commerce.
