Through the thoughtful and thorough grants process, I have also increased my awareness of other needs in Wake County, learned about the numerous non-profits that are meeting these critical needs and have discovered new organizations each year.

I'm always incredibly encouraged by what these non-profits provide, but most importantly by the folks at the helm, like Lotta. I'm very thankful for my committee who is currently reading and scoring 18 grant applications. We started in early June with 50 Letters of Intent. We meet the first week in September to discuss, research, hash out and ultimately select 9 to 10 Wake County non-profits for site visits.
