Appointments are FREE (no hidden costs or fees) for individuals and families whose household income is \$60,000 or less.


Tax Season will run from January 2022 - April 2023.

On February 9, 2023, Stephanie O'Banion served as panelist during a legislative briefing at the State Capitol titled "Strengthen Texas Families and Local Economies: Reform Payday and Auto Title Lending". Over 50 legislative staff members attended and received information on our legislative priorities for the 88th Legislative Session.
