Success Story

We received a referral in June of 2022 for a 70-year-old woman who was the guardian and sole caregiver for her 19- and 20-year-old granddaughters who are both diagnosed with a disability.

The guardian is on a fixed income and was depending on various assistance programs to help her cover the cost of rent and utilities. Once those programs could no longer assist, the guardian was unable to meet the basic needs of her family.

The case managers worked with her for several months to get her connected with resources that would promote her independence. She preferred in-person visits at the
