Town of Ayden Sanitary Sewer Collection System Annual Performance Report For July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015

The Town of Ayden Sewer Collection System consists of sixteen sewer pump stations and approximately 47.8 miles of gravity lines and force mains. Sewer is pumped from the pump stations to the Contentnea Metropolitan Sewer District located in Grifton, North Carolina. The wastewater is treated by that facility and discharged into Contentnea Creek.

Performance:

The Town of Ayden Sanitary Sewer Collection System continued excellence in compliance for the reporting period. The Town of Ayden also recognizes the need to identify and eliminate sources of Inflow and Infiltration (I & I). The majority of these areas have been identified and many have been corrected by use of grants and loans from federal and state funding agencies. Others have been addressed via Town of Ayden funding. Additionally, the Town of Ayden’s Capital Improvement Plan has identified future rehabilitation projects.

Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO):

Stay warm and cut down on your electric usage with the following tips:

- ✂ Open curtains on your south-facing windows during the day to allow sunlight to naturally heat your home, and close them at night to reduce the chill you may feel from cold windows.
- ✂ Use a heavy-duty, clear plastic sheet on a frame or tape clear plastic film to the inside of your window frames during the cold winter months. Make sure the plastic is sealed tightly to the frame to help reduce infiltration.
- ✂ When you are home and awake, set your thermostat as low as comfortable.
- ✂ Seal the air leaks around utility cut-throughs for pipes (“plumbing penetrations”), gaps around chimneys and recessed lights in insulated ceilings, and unfinished spaces behind cupboards and closets.
- ✂ Add caulk or weather-stripping to seal air leaks around leaky doors and windows.
- ✂ Schedule service for your heating system. Replace your furnace filter once a month or as needed.
- ✂ Keep your fireplace damper closed unless a fire is burning. Keeping the damper open is like keeping a window wide open during the winter, it allows warm air to go right up the chimney.
- ✂ Use light-emitting diode or “LED” holiday light strings to reduce the cost of decoration your home for the winter holidays.
- ✂ Turn down the temperature of your water heater to the warm setting (120°F). You’ll not only save energy, you’ll avoid scalding your hands.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS FOR THE HOLIDAYS

During the holiday season, the Ayden Police Department urges residents to secure gifts in their cars out of sight while shopping.

Also, if you are having packages delivered to your home while you are at work or away, have a neighbor keep a look out and sign for the items. This way you won't have packages in your door or on your porch that could be easily taken by a thief.

After you open your presents on Christmas day, be careful not to leave boxes in front of your house that high end items like televisions, computers, video gaming systems came in. This allows potential thieves to know that these items are in your house and lets them know that your residence is a good target for breaking in.

If you plan on being away for the holidays, we always encourage residents to stop by the Police Department and complete a house check form. This lets us know that you are away and we will check the residence each day and night until you return.
