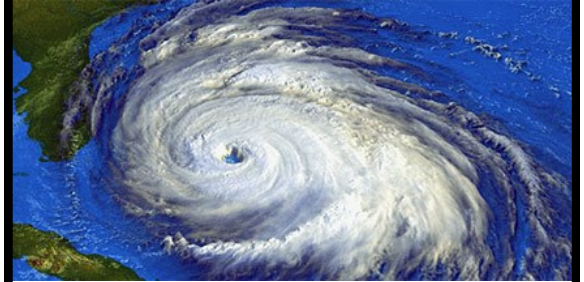

Town Ordinance Key Points for Debris Pick Up

The Town is seeing a large increase in residential building debris. The Town only picks up debris generated by a citizen's remodeling efforts, not by a contractor doing work at a private house.

- It is unlawful for any person to throw or deposit, sweep, or rake into any street or sidewalk, or gutter, any leaves, refuse, ashes, waste, loose paper or other waste matter.
- All material should be placed neatly in a pile adjacent to the curb or the street edge so it can be reached for debris removal. Debris needs to be placed away from electric poles or guidelines so the Town's Knuckle boom is not impeded in picking up the debris.
- Loose leaf pick up is from October 15th until the end of January.
- Yard clippings and leaves outside of leaf season must be bagged in disposable containers or tarps for pick up.
- Yard clippings and shrub cuttings by yard contractors must be removed by the contractor. The curb pick up service is for home-owner generated waste.
- All builders and contractors are required to remove their building rubbish, debris and trash. Material placed at the street by the contractor for the Town to pick up will result in the property owner being charged for removal.
- Only home repair materials done by owners are permitted for pick up by the Town.

HURRICANE SEASON IS HERE.....

We're prepared, are you? The first step to ensuring your family's safety is having an emergency plan in place. Everyone needs to be prepared for the unexpected and an emergency kit is a great way to make sure you have the proper supplies ready in the event a hurricane makes landfall near our coast.

An emergency kit should include:

- At least a 3-day supply of water (one gallon per person, per day)
- At least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food
- At least, one change of clothing and shoes per person
- One blanket or sleeping bag per person
- First-aid kit
- Battery-powered NWR and portable radio
- Emergency tools
- Flashlight, extra batteries
- Extra set of car keys
- Credit card and cash
- Special items for infant, elderly or disabled family members
- Prescription and non-prescription medicines

Mosquito spraying will start in May!!! An important part of mosquito control around your home is making sure that mosquitoes don't have a place to lay their eggs. Follow these simple tips to help make your time outside more enjoyable:

- Get rid of standing water in rain gutters, old tires, buckets, plastic covers, toys or any other container where mosquitoes can breed.
- Empty and change the water in bird baths, fountains, wading pools, rain barrels, and potted plant trays at least once a week to eliminate potential mosquito habitats
- Drain temporary pools of water or fill with dirt.
- Keep swimming pool water treated and circulating.
