The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2019-2020** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2019**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above. Services should be able to serve youth from 6-17 years old. For fiscal year 2019-2020, programs submitting proposals should consider the new "Raise the Age Law" effective 12/01/2019 that increase the age of juvenile to include 16-17 year old youth.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Of 36 youth coming to the attention of Juvenile Services in FY 17-18, 40% or 14 youth at intake were reported to need substance abuse assessment and/or treatment; 83% or 30 youth at intake were reported to have serious school behavior problems; and 70% or 25 youth at intake lacked pro-social relationships.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain:	Indicators suggest that 8% or 3 youth were rejected by positive peers; 43% or 15 youth had some association with delinquent peers; 15% or 5 youth had regular association with delinquent peers; and 5% or 2 youth had gang
Individual Domain:	40% or 14 youth at intake indicated the need for substance abuse assessment and/or treatment; 35% or 13 youth at intake were reported needing more MH assessment
Family Domain:	23% or 8 youth at intake reported domestic discord or violence in home; 68% or 24 youth assessed come from families where parent(s) have marginal supervision skills; 60% or 22 youth have families with a criminal history.
School Domain:	81% or 29 youth at intake reported to have moderate or serious school behavior problems. 23% or 8 youth were below grade level.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
