

“After-School/After-Work” Pediatric COVID Vaccination Events: On Wednesday, 11-10-21 and Wednesday 11-17-21, the Franklin County Health Department (FCHD) will be offering extended after-school/after-work vaccination clinic hours for children ages 5-11 to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. On these two days, appointments are available from 4:00pm -6:00pm so that children don’t have to miss school, and parents won’t have to miss work. “Safe for the Holidays” Vaccination Event: With Franklin County School District’s Students already being off on Wednesday, 11-24-21, the Franklin County Health Department is pleased to announce we will be having a special pediatric vaccination clinic that day. Appointments will be available throughout the day (morning and afternoon) on Wednesday, 11/24/21 (the day before Thanksgiving), and a parent must accompany the child to have them get a vaccination. Parents can make an appointment to bring their children to this event at FCHD in Louisburg by using the same scheduling-link: <https://www.franklincountync.us/covid>

County Health Director, Scott LaVigne, stated “The same Pfizer Vaccine that’s helped hundreds of Franklin County youth ages 12-17 avoid getting COVID, is now available in a lower pediatric dose that has been shown to be safe and effective for kids ages 5-11. It’s a great way to get kids ready to safely see their family and friends as the holidays approach. If you bring your child to one of these events, and get a follow-up vaccine three-weeks later, your child could be fully vaccinated (and protected) by the Holidays and before the New Year begins!”
