

NOVEMBER 1, 1993

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman James G. Hardy, Vice Chairman George T. Wynne, Commissioner Harry L. Foy, Jr., Commissioner James T. Moss, Jr. and Commissioner Robert L. Swanson.

Upon motion by Commissioner Foy, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the minutes of meetings held on October 4, 6 and 18, 1993 approved.

Proper notice having been given this is the time and place set for a public hearing to receive comments regarding request for Special Use Permit from Kenneth P. Smith for "Grounds and Facilities for Open Air Games & Sporting Events" (riding ring & horse show) at the intersection of State Road 1407 & State Road 1410 in Sandy Creek Township.

Chairman Hardy declared public hearing open at 7:35 P. M. and recognized County Planner Walter Moorman who made comments concerning this request for Special Use Permit.

Chairman Hardy then called for public comments and no one spoke.

Chairman Hardy declared public hearing closed at 7:45 P. M.

Upon motion by Commissioner Swanson, seconded by Commissioner Foy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried upon the recommendation of the Franklin County Planning Board and after consideration of each of the following conditions, the request for a Special ' Use Permit by Kenneth P. Smith for "Grounds and Facilities for Open Air Games & Sporting Events" (riding ring & horse show) at the intersection of State Road 1407 & State Road 1410 in Sandy Creek Township:

1. All applicable specific conditions pertaining to the proposed use have been or will be satisfied.
2. Access roads or entrance and exist drives are or will be sufficient in size and properly located to ensure automotive and pederstrian safety and convenience, traffic flow, and control and access in case of fire or other emergency.
3. Off-street parking, loading, refuse, and other service areas are located so as to be safe, convenient, allow for access in case of emergency and to minimize economic, glare, odor, and other impacts on adjoining properties in the general neighborhood.

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4. Utilities, schools, fire, police and other necessary public and private facilities and services will be adequate to handle the proposed use.
5. The location and arrangement of the use of the site, screening, buffering, landscaping, and pedestrian ways harmonize with adjoining properties and the general area and minimize adverse impact.
6. The type, size, and intensity of the proposed use, including such considerations as hours of operation and number of people who are likely to utilize or be attracted to the use, will not have significant adverse impact on adjoining properties or the neighborhood.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Swanson with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following resolution honoring youth participation in livestock exhibits at the 1993 North Carolina State Fair approved:

Upon motion by Commissioner Moss, seconded by Commissioner Swanson with all present voting "AYE" duly carried approve the installation of automatic air release valves on the 6" force main from Novo Nordisk plant along NC #56 to Franklinton at a cost of \$5,100.00

Upon motion by Commissioner Moss, seconded by Commissioner Foy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that the Board of Commissioners hold a public hearing during the meeting of the Board, which begins at 7:30 P. M., on November 16, 1993 to receive public comments on proposed ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE EMISSION OF NOISE IN FRANKLIN COUNTY".

Upon motion by Commissioner Swanson, seconded by Commissioner Foy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following proclamation proclaiming National Diabetes Month in Franklin County adopted:

**PROCLAMATION
NATIONAL DIABETES MONTH IN FRANKLIN COUNTY
NOVEMBER, 1993**

WHEREAS, diabetes is a problem of grave concern and consequence in American society with serious complications and effects which can be lessened through tight blood glucose monitoring and education as recently proven through the Diabetes Control and Complications Trials (DCCT); and,

WHEREAS, more than 13 million people in America, including many people not yet diagnosed, are affected by diabetes; 500,000 new cases are diagnosed yearly; and,

WHEREAS, diabetes is a leading cause of death and a major cause of disability throughout our nation, with more than 50,000 lower extremity amputations performed on people with diabetes annually, a rate 15 times higher than that of the non-diabetic population; and,

WHEREAS, death from kidney disease is 500 times more common among young adults with insulin-dependent diabetes than in the general population; diabetes is the leading cause of new blindness in adults; and,

WHEREAS, half of all people with diabetes have a history of hypertension compared to 20 percent of the general population and people with diabetes are twice as likely as members of the general population to have heart disease and are more likely to die from it; and,

WHEREAS, pregnant women with diabetes require intensive prenatal care and their babies are five times more likely to require intensive care during-and immediately following birth than other babies; and,

WHEREAS, diabetes awareness and education can lessen or prevent the complications associated with diabetes and enable persons with diabetes live more independent and fulfilling lives;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVLED that the Franklin County Board of Commissioners designate the month of November, 1993 as

NATIONAL DIABETES MONTH

and call upon the people of Franklin County to observe the month with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

ADOPTED this the 1st day of November, 1993.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Moss with all present voting "AYE" duly carried pursuant to request from the Town of Youngsville, that they be authorized to exercise subdivision regulations within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the town.

Upon motion by Commissioner Swanson, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that the Franklin County Health Department be authorized to create a new permanent part-time Animal Control Officer I position at a rate of \$7.26 per hour for up to 19 hours per week.

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Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Moss with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the Board of Commissioners' meeting scheduled for Monday, November 15, 1993 be changed to Tuesday, November 16, 1993.
