Upon motion by Commissioner Foy, seconded by Commissioner Hardy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried upon the recommendation of the Franklin County Planning Board, the following ordinance amending the Franklin County Unified Development Ordinance adopted:

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FRANKLIN COUNTY UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE
(TEXT) IN REFERENCE TO**

**ADDING CABINET/WOODWORKING SHOPS AS A CONDITIONAL USE IN THE
AGRICULTURAL-RESIDENTIAL (AR) DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Commissioners duly adopted the Franklin County Zoning Ordinance on January 5, 1987; the Subdivision Ordinance on August 1, 1985, the Mobile Home & Travel Trailer Park Ordinance on October 21, 1985; and,

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Commissioners duly adopted the Franklin County Unified Development Ordinance on September 16, 1991; and,

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Planning Board has provided a recommendation per the requirements of the Franklin County Unified Development Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing of the Board of Commissioners has been scheduled, duly advertised, per the requirements of G. S. 153A and conducted on July 17, 1995; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Board of Commissioners has acted favorably on the Planning Board recommendation and provides the following amending ordinance:

SECTION I That Chapter 2, Article II, Section 11-2 Agricultural-Residential District (AR), D. Conditional Uses be amended to add the following:

Cabinet/Woodworking Shop

- a. Provided the building not exceed 1,200 square feet
- b. Minimum lot size: 3 acres
- c. Owner/Operator live on site
- d. Outdoor storage: shall conform to Article 11-6, Standards For Outdoor Storage
- e. Parking: shall conform to Article V, Off-Street Parking & Loading Requirements
- f. Screening: shall conform to Article I-II, Buffer Strips
- g. Lighting: lighting shall be such that it is not directed onto any adjacent residential lot

SECTION II That this ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

APPROXIMATELY 6.44 ACRES LOCATED BETWEEN NC 56 AND STATE ROAD 1491 IN
LOUISBURG TOWNSHIP
FROM AGRICULTURAL-RESIDENTIAL TO HIGHWAY BUSINESS**

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Planning Board has reviewed said petition and favorably recommends amendment per the requirements of the Franklin County Unified Development Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing of the Board of Commissioners has been scheduled, duly advertised, per the requirements of G. S. 153A and conducted on July 17, 1995, and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Board of Commissioners has acted favorably on the petition and provides the following amending ordinance.

SECTION I That the approximately 6.44 acres located in Louisburg Township between NC 56 and State Road 1491 (Moose Loop Road) including Franklin County Tax Map 16, Parcels 41C and 43B (4.94 acres) and the portion of Parcel 43 on the north side of NC 56 (approximately 1.5 acres) be rezoned from Agricultural Residential to the Highway Business District.

**PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION
NORTH RALEIGH FARMS PROJECT**

WHEREAS, Article 9 of Chapter 153A, General Statutes of North Carolina authorizes counties to make special assessments against benefited property for all or part of the costs of paving or otherwise improving streets;

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Commissioners desire to assist in the improvement of certain substandard streets in the North Raleigh Farms Subdivision in Franklin County, namely North Raleigh Farms Road, Jason Way, Beech Cove, Ridgewood Road and White Oak Drive;

WHEREAS, special assessment against the benefited property is necessary to recoup the costs of said improvements to be financed by the county;

WHEREAS, the improvements shall consist of the necessary grading and construction for the paving of said streets to a standard so as to permit acceptance of said streets by the Department of Transportation for perpetual road maintenance;

WHEREAS, it appears that more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the owners of property to be assessed, who represent more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the lineal feet of frontage of lands

abutting the street to be improved have signed a petition agreeing to special assessments for the street improvements.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The county manager or other responsible party prepare a preliminary assessment roll indicating each property subject to assessment if the project is undertaken;
2. The total cost of desired improvements shall be assessed a rate equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of said improvements and the basis for said assessment shall be on a per lot basis for all property abutting the roads to be improved.
3. The property owners being assessed shall not be subject to any finance charge if said assessment is paid in full within sixty (60) days of the confirmation of the assessment roll by the Board. However, if said assessment is not paid in full by this date, the property owner shall be assessed a finance charge equal to 8% of the outstanding balance from said date with the total assessment being amortized over a term of ten (10) years with annual payments being due and collected by the Tax Collector along with ad valorem taxes. All remedies available to the tax collector may be utilized in the collection of said assessments and each assessment shall be a lien on the property assessed of the same nature and to the same extent as the lien for county property taxes.
4. No assessments shall be held in abeyance without interest for the term of sixty (60) days as outlined above.
5. A public hearing shall be held on the 11th day of September, 1995 at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse for the purpose of hearing all interested persons in respect to the contents of the preliminary assessment resolution.
6. The Clerk to the Board is hereby directed to cause to be published a notice of the public hearing and to mail to each owner of property appearing on the preliminary assessment roll a copy of this resolution at least ten (10) days prior to the public hearing.
