

**OCTOBER 21, 1996**

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Judge Hamilton H. Hobgood Courthouse Annex with the following Commissioners present: Chairman Robert L. Swanson, Vice Chairman James G. Hardy, Commissioner Harry L. Foy, Jr., Commissioner James T. Moss, Jr. and Commissioner George T. Wynne.

Upon motion by Commissioner Hardy, seconded by Commissioner Moss with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the minutes of the meeting held on October 7, 1996, approved.

Proper notice having been given, this is the time and place set for a public hearing to receive citizen comment on the proposed changing of names of certain state roads and certain non-state roads.

Chairman Swanson declared public hearing open and recognized County Planner Jeff Coutu who made comments regarding the proposed name changes.

Chairman Swanson then called for public comment and the following people spoke:

for 60 years - want name to be Duke-Valentine Road

Jerry Temple, Route 3, Box 180A, Louisburg, NC

Jim Ray Crossing-Riley Road - name too long for signs,  
request name be changed back to Old Halifax Road

William Newbill, Route 2, Box 313, Spring Hope, NC

Alfred Batchelor Lane -only four houses - request  
road be named Justice Lane

Diane Boyd, Route 3, Box 480, Louisburg, NC

Alvins Way - request road name be changed to Lloyd's Way

H. L. Johnson, Route 5, Box 440-A, Zebulon, NC

Footman's Way - represents all petitioners - wants road name  
changed back to Lake Shore Drive - no other street by name

Inez Foster, Route 2, Box 430, Spring Hope, NC

Green Way - Wilkins have lived on road for 80 years,  
discussed with Mr. Green and he concurs - wants name to  
be Wilkins Way

Ray Taylor, P. O. Box 549, Louisburg, NC  
Lumpkin Way - to avoid confusion with neighbor on the location,  
wants name to be Ray-Beck Road

LucyHeath, Route 2, Box 241H, Zebulon, NC  
Swett - wants road name to be Hawks Way Road - read

Autry Pridgen, Route 1, Box 264, Louisburg, NC  
Dump Horton Road - wants road to be named Dump Horton Road

JeanBaker, Route 1, Box 330, Louisburg, NC  
Dump Horton Road - wants road to be named Dump Horton Road

William A. Roberson, Route 1, Box 49, Louisburg, NC  
Fire Way - stated unlawful for county to name non-state roads –  
wants ordinance changed to protect property owners-wants road to  
be named Mylands Road

William A. Roberson, Route 1, Box 49, Louisburg, NC  
Roberson Lane - unlawful for county to name non-state roads  
wants ordinance changed to protect property owners

Clarence Massenburg, Route 6, Box 264, Louisburg, NC  
Schloss Road - presented petition with 82 signatures requesting  
that road be named Schloss Road and not Schloss Racetrack Road

Chairman Swanson called for further, comments and hearing none declared the public hearing closed.

Chairman Swanson requested County Attorney Batton to review possible amendments to the ordinance naming roads and report back to the Board and a decision on road names discussed during the public hearing should be made within thirty (30) days.

Upon motion by Commissioner Foy accept and approve road name changes as presented contingent upon the County Attorney's review of concerns presented by Mr. William Robertson in which he stated that the county could not legally name non-state roads. The motion died for lack of a second.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moss, seconded by Commissioner Hardy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that a proclamation entitled "ADULT IMMUNIZATION AWARENESS WEEK, SENIOR VACCINATION SUNDAY IN FRANKLIN COUNTY, 199611 be approved.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moss, seconded by Commissioner Hardy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried adopt a RESOLUTION requesting the State of North Carolina to release funds in the amount of \$9,259.94 to the Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 324, House Bill 229, Section 9.4 of the 1995 Session Laws; Resolution is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Hardy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried award the bid to CFW, Inc. for the base bid and the alternate bid for a total amount of \$79,000 for repairs to the exterior and roof of the Courthouse.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moss, seconded by Commissioner Hardy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried approve tax releases for September, 1996; copy of releases are on file in the County Manager's Office and the Tax Collector's Office.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Moss with all present voting "AYE" duly carried approve the boundaries of the Western Franklin Fire Insurance District as agreed upon by the fire chiefs of Youngsville and Bunn; copy of description and map of this district on file in the County Manager's Office and the Emergency Management Office.

Upon motion by Commissioner Hardy, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried establish a minimum bid of \$15,000 for the former Board of Elections /Veterans Service Office Building, 217 Court Street, Louisburg, NC.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Moss with all present voting "AYE" duly carried approve the assignment of a transition team to the new jail facility and authorize the allocation of one additional jailer position to the jail staff.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Hardy with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that upon the recommendation of Architect Surapon Sujjavanich, the following bids awarded to the low bidders for office furniture, security furniture and signage for the new Law Enforcement facility:
