
APRIL 18, 1988

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman John O. Sledge, III, Vice Chairman James B. Alford, Commissioner Ronald W. Goswick, Commissioner Robert L. Swanson and Commissioner Tommy Wynne.

Mr. Benny Ray Gupton, Chairman of the Franklin Soil and Water Conservation District Board, appeared before the Board to request designation of Soil & Water Stewardship Week. Chairman Sledge proclaimed the week of April 24-May 1, 1988, as Soil & Water Stewardship Week and the following proclamation approved:

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the well-being of our people depends -upon the production of ample supplies of food, fiber and other products of the soil, and

WHEREAS, the quality and quantity of these products depend upon the conservation, wise and proper management of the soil and water resources; and

WHEREAS, protection of our surface waters from pollution is dependent upon protection of soils from begin blown or washed into those waters;

WHEREAS, conservation districts provide a practical and democratic organization through which landowners are taking the initiative to conserve and make proper use of these resources; and

WHEREAS, the soil conservation movement is carrying forward a program of soil and water

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conservation in cooperation with numerous agencies and countless individuals:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, in full appreciation of the value of our soil and water resources to the public welfare, and desiring to honor those who protect those resources, do hereby proclaim April 24-May 1, 1988

SOIL AND WATER STEWARDSHIP WEEK
in the County of Franklin.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have thereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the County of Franklin to be affixed.

Mr. Mike Nashleanas made a presentation on North Carolina Counties Liability and Property Insurance Pool Fund.

Proper notice having been given, this is the time and place set for a public hearing to explain the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program and to allow the citizens of Franklin County to express their views concerning community development needs and priorities.

Chairman Sledge declared public hearing open at 8:15 P. M. and recognized Mr. Joe Durham of L. E. Wooten Company, who explained the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program.

Chairman Sledge then called for comments from the public and the following persons spoke:

Mr. Ken Tippet, Louisburg Planning Director, requested that the target area for this grant be south of the corporate limits of Louisburg, Chestnut, Hayes and Grant Streets.

Chairman Sledge declared public hearing closed at 8:30 P. M.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly carried a public hearing be held on Monday, May 9, 1988, at 7:30 P. M. pertaining to the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Swanson with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that upon the recommendation of the county manager and Peirson & Whitman Engineering, award water/sewer construction contract for construction of water/sewer facilities to the Franklin Park Industrial Center to Hendrix-Barnhill Company, Greenville, NC at a cost of \$282,661.00.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly

After a discussion of the petition to rezone a 1.32 acre tract of land from AR to HB, upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that the petition to rezone a 1.32 acre tract of land located on U. S. #1 from AR to HB be denied based on the fact that the property owner's attorney stated that owner did not want property rezoned. A letter

received from Robert Abbott requesting rezoning of this property on file in the Franklin County Planning Department.

Pursuant to and in accordance with G. S. 143-318.11 and upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the Board went into executive session to discuss land acquisition.

The Board reconvened into regular session and Chairman Sledge stated no action taken.

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Upon motion by Commissioner Swanson, seconded by Commissioner Goswick with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the motion calling for a public hearing on amendments to the Subdivision Regulations and motion calling for a public hearing on amendments to the Mobile Home Park & Travel Trailer Park Ordinance that were made at the meeting of the Board of Commissioners on April 4, 1988, be rescinded.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly carried Chairman Sledge authorized to sign an Approval & Award of Grant in an amount not to exceed \$455,270 issued pursuant to application for federal assistance from the United States Department of Commerce to extend water and sewer services to the Highway I and I-A industrial corridors near Youngsville.

There being no further business to come before the Board, adjournment recorded at 9:30 P. M.
