The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman John O. Sledge, III, Vice Chairman James B. Alford, Commissioner Ronald W. Goswick, Commissioner Robert L. Swanson and Commissioner Tommy Wynne.

Mr. Donnie Rudd, Franklin County Tax Collector, appeared before the Board concerning the tax settlement for 1987. Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried accept tax settlement report for 1987 and the list of insolvent taxes be charged back to the tax collector for collection; this Franklin County Uncollected Taxes Register for 6-25-87 is on file in the Franklin County clerk's office.

Upon motion by Commissioner Alford, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried Tax Collector Donnie Rudd charged with collection of the 1988 taxes.

Representative George Brannan appeared before the Board to announce that a total of \$110,000.00 had been appropriated by the North Carolina General Assembly to be used for a Senior Citizens Center in Louisburg.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the \$1,800.00 be appropriated to the Franklin County Firemen's Association to be used as matching funds for the purchase of an air compressor, and the following budget amendment be approved:

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following proclamation proclaiming Habitat for Humanity Week approved:
