

JUNE 20, 1988

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman John O. Sledge, III, Vice Chairman James B. Alford, Commissioner Ronald W. Goswick, Commissioner Robert L. Swanson and Commissioner Tommy Wynne.

Proper notice having been given this is the time and place set for a public hearing to receive public comment concerning the inclusion of the Town of Youngsville in the Youngsville Area Fire Service District.

Chairman Sledge declared public hearing open at 7:35 P. M. and recognized County Manager Boutwell who made comments pertaining to this matter.

Chairman Sledge then called for public comments and no one spoke.

Chairman Sledge declared public hearing closed at 7:45 P. M.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following resolution amending the Youngsville Area Fire District adopted:

RESOLUTION OF THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
AMENDING THE YOUNGVILLE AREA FIRE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Commissioners duly adopted a resolution establishing fire districts within Franklin County on the 21st day of December, 1987; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 16 of Chapter 153A of the North Carolina General Statutes, the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County have determined that there is a demonstrable need for providing fire service districts within Franklin County and that it is practical for the Town of Youngsville to be included in the Youngsville area fire service district; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Youngsville duly adopted a resolution joining the town to the county fire tax system on the 14th day of April, 1988.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Franklin County Board of Commissioners as follows:  
Section 1. That the incorporated Town of Youngsville, having duly elected to join in the fire service district in which it is located, is included in the Youngsville area fire tax district;  
Section 2. This resolution shall become effective beginning with 1988-89 fiscal year.

Dr. Terri Weber Emergency Services Director, Franklin Regional Medical Center, appeared before the Board to present a proposal for paramedic training. Chairman Sledge advised that a decision would be made at a later date.

Such rates are based on an estimated total appraised value of property for the purpose of taxation of \$680,000.00 with an assesment ratio of 100% of appraised value. Estimated collection rate of 92% is based on previous collection rate of 91.56 per cent.
