

MARCH 20, 1989

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman James B. Alford; Vice Chairman Tommy Wynne; Commissioner Ronald W. Goswick; Commissioner John O. Sledge, III and Commissioner and Commissioner Robert L. Swanson.

County Manager Boutwell presented a proposed junkyard ordinance for consideration by the Board.

After a discussion, upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Wynne with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that the proposed junkyard ordinance be accepted for review but request this proposed ordinance be sent back to the Franklin County Planning Board and the Franklin County Zoning Ordinance be amended to include regulation of junkyards; and the public hearing scheduled for April 3, 1989 to receive public comments on proposed junkyard ordinance be cancelled.

Upon motion by Commissioner Wynne, seconded by Commissioner Goswick with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that a public hearing be held during the meeting of the Board of Commissioners, which begins at 7:30 P. M., on Monday, April 17, 1989 to receive public comments on amendment to the Franklin County Zoning Ordinance to include regulation of junkyards.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Sledge with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following resolution honoring the memory of Jane Murphy York adopted:

**RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF JANE MURPHY YORK**

WHEREAS, Franklin County has been operating a department of social services since 1921; and,

WHEREAS, Jane Murphy York was associated with the agency from 1957-1988, first as a caseworker and than as director from 1963 until her retirement in 1988; and,

WHEREAS, Mrs. York was instrumental in expanding and leading services to the citizens of Franklin County; and,

WHEREAS, Mrs. York provided a meaningful and sound leadership in providing special programs to the needy in Franklin County; and,

WHEREAS, during her tenure, Mrs. York stressed innovative planning and hard work to develop resources and meet the multiple needs of Franklin County citizens while avoiding complacency in the work force; and,

WHEREAS, Jane Murphy York passed away on March 6, 1989,  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Franklin County Board of Commissioners assembled in regular session in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse on this the 20th day of March, 1989 at 7:30 P. M. turn from routine business and reflect upon the life and contribution of Jane Murphy York;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Board expresses its sympathy and condolences to the family of Jane Murphy York;

BE IT ALSO FURTHER RESOLVED that a 'Copy of this resolution be entered into the minutes of this meeting and copies be forwarded to the family of Mrs. York.

... the intersection of Cedar Creek and SR1125. Thence continuing downstream along Cedar Creek to ...

Point No. 8

... the intersection of Cedar Creek and SRII16. Thence continuing downstream along Cedar Creek to ...

Point No. 9

...the intersection of Cedar Creek and SR1105. Thence northward along SR1105 to ...

Point No. 10

... the intersection of SR1105, and SR1003. Thence continuing eastward along NC 56 to the intersection of NC 56 and SR1222,

... and returning westward along NC 56 to Point 10. thence continuing northward along SR1003 to ...

... the confluence of Buffaloe Creek and Tar River. Thence continuing upstream along Rar River to ...

Point No. 15

... the intersection of Tar River and SR1103 at Sims Bridge. Thence continuing upstream along the Tar River to ...

Point No. 16

... the intersection of Tar River and U. S. 1. Thence continuing upstream along the Tar River to ...

Point No. 17

... the intersection of Tar River and SR1205. Thence continuing along the Franklin-Granville County Line to ...

Point No. 18

... the intersection of the Franklin-Granville County Line with SR1200. Thence continuing along the Franklin-Granville County Line to the beginning, Point No. 1, at the intersection of the Franklin-Granville County Line and NC 56.
