

JANUARY 15, 1990

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman George T. Wynne, Vice Chairman Ronald W. Goswick, Commissioner James B. Alford, Commissioner John O. Sledge, III and Commissioner Robert L. Swanson.

Mrs. Mary Murphy, Chairman of the Franklin Soil & Water Conservation District Board and Mr. Lee Mallard, Soil Scientist, United States Department of Agriculture, reported to the Board on the progress of the Soil Survey being prepared for Franklin County.

Mr. Bob Pearson, Pearson's Appraisal, presented an update on activities taking place in the revaluation of property program being conducted in Franklin County. He advised the Board that the revaluation notices would be mailed to the Franklin County property owners on Friday, January 19, 1990.

Mr. Cyrus Johnson appeared before the Board concerning the need for the purchase of recycled products as an incentive to recycle. He requested that Franklin County Government consider the purchase of recycled

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products. After a discussion of this matter, the Board requested the county manager to check the feasibility of Franklin County Government purchasing recycled products.

Upon motion by Commissioner Alford, seconded by Commissioner Swanson with all present voting "AYE" duly carried approve road petition for Stallings Crossing Subdivision and forward to the North Carolina Department of Transportation for evaluation and review.,

The Board discussed an ordinance establishing enforcement procedures of the North Carolina Building Code. This matter was tabled until the next meeting to allow the Franklin County Home Builders Association time to review this ordinance.

The Board discussed a proposed residential street improvement policy. The Board concluded more information was needed before action taken on this matter.

The Board discussed a proposed ordinance amending the Franklin County Subdivision Regulations regarding Article II Definition of Terms, Article IV-Section 404.2 Lots and Section 405.9 Private Roads. No action taken.

County Manager Boutwell announced the employment of Mr. Richard Reid as the director of the Franklin County Department of Planning & Development, effective January 22, 1990.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Sledge with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following Cardboard Buy Back Policy approved:

FRANKLIN COUNTY CARDBOARD BUY BACK POLICY

- PURPOSE:** To encourage recycling of cardboard waste by providing financial incentive for large producers of cardboard waste.
- METHOD:** Franklin County will purchase cardboard delivered to the Franklin County Landfill at a price of \$10.00 per ton. As eligible participants in this program bring cardboard waste to the landfill, the waste shall be weighed to determine volume for purchase. Each seller will receive a receipt for cardboard waste delivered to the landfill. All cardboard waste included in this program must be clean and free of other types of waste.
- RESPONSIBILITY:** The seller of cardboard waste shall be responsible for delivering the material to the landfill. The material delivered does not have to be compacted or bound. Responsibility for removal from the seller's vehicle shall be joint.
- ELIGIBILITY:** Only large producers/collectors of cardboard waste are eligible for this program. Eligibility is limited to Franklin County businesses, towns, and institutions or their appointed agents or haulers. Application is to be made with the Franklin County Solid Waste Manager.
- PAYMENT:** Payments to sellers of cardboard shall be monthly.
- EFFECTIVE DATE:** This policy is effective February 1, 1990 and shall remain effective as long as markets are available for Franklin County to dispose of the cardboard waste.

ADOPTED this the 15th day of January, 1990.

Upon motion by Commissioner Swanson, seconded by Commissioner Sledge with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that a public hearing be held during the meeting of the Board of Commissioners, which begins at 7:30 P. M., on Tuesday, February 6, 1990, to receive public comments on proposed amendment to the Franklin County Zoning Ordinance.

Pursuant to and in accordance with G.S. 143-318.11 and upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Swanson with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the Board went into executive session to discuss land acquisition.

The Board reconvened into regular session and Chairman Wynne stated no action to be taken as a result of the executive session.

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There being no further business to come before the Board, adjournment recorded at 9:30 P. M.
