
JUNE 19, 1990

The Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in recessed session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman George T. Wynne, Commissioner James B. Alford, Commissioner John O. Sledge and Commissioner Robert L. Swanson. Commissioner Ronald W. Goswick absent.

Proper notice having been given, this is the time and place set for a public hearing to receive public comments an proposed street improvement policy.

Chairman Wynne declared public hearing open at 7:35 P. M. and recognized County Manager Boutwell who made comments concerning the proposed street improvement policy.

RESOLUTION HONORING LOCAL NATIONAL GUARD UNIT

WHEREAS, the Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 5th Battalion, 113th Field Artillery, of the North Carolina Army National Guard, located on South Bickett Boulevard, Louisburg, North Carolina will participate in "Operation Patriotism" on June 30, 1990; and,

WHEREAS, soldiers assigned to the Louisburg Unit of the North Carolina National Guard will run the United States flag through the city and issue an invitation from the Honorable James G. Martin, Governor

of North Carolina, to go to Raleigh on the Fourth of July, 1990 for a grand celebration of the 150th anniversary of the State Capitol; and,

WHEREAS, ceremonies will be conducted at the steps of the Franklin County Courthouse in coordination with the upcoming anniversary celebration; and,

WHEREAS, the 150th Capitol Celebration will be held to initiate activities and recreate significant events of the past 150 years in order to remember and appreciate the lessons of North Carolina history, using the Capitol as the focal point,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Franklin County Board of Commissioners that the Louisburg unit of the North Carolina National Guard is hereby honored and commended for its participation in the Capitol Celebration of the 150th anniversary of the State Capitol;
