

SEPTEMBER 4, 1990

The Franklin County Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, North Carolina met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. in the Superior Courtroom of the Franklin County Courthouse with the following Commissioners present: Chairman George T. Wynne, Vice Chairman Ronald W. Goswick, Commissioner James B. Alford, Commissioner Robert L. Swanson. Commissioner John O. Sledge, III was absent.

Mr. Keith Patton, Franklin County Health Director, presented a proposed animal control ordinance for consideration by the Board of Commissioners.

Upon motion by Commissioner Sledge, seconded by Commissioner Goswick with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that a public hearing be held during the meeting of the Board of Commissioners, which begins at 7:30 P. M. on Monday, October 1, 1990 to receive public comments on proposed animal control ordinance and that each municipality in the county receive a copy of proposed ordinance.

Upon motion by Commissioner Sledge, seconded by Commissioner Alford with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following proclamation adopted proclaiming Hunting and Fishing Day in Franklin County:

## PROCLAMATION

### HUNTING AND FISHING DAY

WHEREAS, hunting and fishing have always been an important part of the American tradition and while these activities may no longer be necessary for survival, as in colonial times, they are still relevant today; and,

WHEREAS, for over 100 years, sportsmen have been in the forefront of the conservation movement by not being content with merely vocalizing their support, hunters and fishermen requested special fees and taxes on their equipment which help pay for wildlife management and other conservation programs; and,

WHEREAS, over the years, monies raised totaled over \$8 Billion for conservation; and,

WHEREAS, these sportsmen-financed programs have led to the dramatic comeback of many species such as whitetailed deer, elk, antelope and wild turkey and have benefited all wildlife; and,

WHEREAS, as individuals and through their organizations, hunters and fishermen volunteer countless hours of their time for local conservation projects and to raise funds for conservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, we the Franklin County Board of Commissioners do hereby proclaim SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 1990, as

#### HUNTING AND FISHING DAY IN FRANKLIN COUNTY

and call upon all citizens to join with sportsmenconservationists in their efforts to ensure the wise use and proper management of our natural resources to benefit future generations.

Upon motion by Commissioner Alford, seconded by Commissioner Sledge with all present voting "AYE" duly carried the following amending ordinance to the Franklin County Building Code Ordinance adopted:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE ADOPTION, ADMINISTRATION, AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE

BUILDING CODE FOR THE COUNTY OF FRANKLIN

THAT WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Statutes require each county to enforce the North Carolina Building Code as enacted and amended, for all unincorporated portions of the county; and (North Carolina General Statutes, Sections 153A-122, 320, 341, 352, and 354)

WHEREAS, in order to carry out this obligation, it is necessary for Franklin County to adopt rules regulations to administer the North Carolina Building Code: and,

WHEREAS, Franklin County has established a Department of Planning and Development to administer the North Carolina Building Code and this ordinance,

WHEREAS, Franklin County adopted a building code ordinance and fee schedule on the 16th day of April, 1990.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Board of Commissioners for Franklin County amend this

ordinance fee schedule as follows:

(change of use) 50.00

Annual Inspections 20.00

4. Foster Homes 20.00

This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption this the 4th day of September, 1990.

Upon motion by Commissioner Goswick, seconded by Commissioner Sledge with all present voting "AYE" duly carried Joseph B. Cutchins appointed to serve a three-year term, expiring September, 1993, on the Franklin County Planning Board.

Upon motion by Commissioner Sledge, seconded by Commissioner Goswick with all present voting "AYE" duly carried Emma Ruth Stewart and Vickie Hight reappointed to serve a three-year term, expiring June, 1993, on the Franklin County Library Board.

Upon motion by Commissioner Alford, seconded by Commissioner Sledge with all present voting "AYE" duly carried that at the request of the Bunn Rural Fire Department Robert B. Seymour appointed to serve on the Bunn Rural Fire Department Board of Trustees to allow collection of monies for the firemen's relief fund.
