- 1. TPAC Subcommittee Structures & Guidelines
 A work item on the Process Subcommittee is to continue its work on formalizing the structure and
 functionality of the standing TPAC Subcommittees, including proposed bylaws, membership guidelines,
 and meeting guidance. Elements to discuss include:
- **Subcommittee Chair(s)** how to elect (currently subcommittee recommends a chair to the TPAC and TPAC approves; chair must be member or alternate on TPAC); do we need terms or term limits?
- Membership currently membership to committees is open; this does not lend itself to quorum for decision-making. Should membership be formalized?
- Work Plans/Task List standardize how work plans for committees are developed, including schedule and status reports? Maybe have work plans submitted to TPAC quarterly, with regular progress reports at TPAC meetings?
- Meeting agendas/summaries Suggest: Committee chairs should endeavor to get agendas out 3 days in advance; TPAC administrator shall record meeting summaries & post to TPAC website. Regular meeting schedules should be published
- **Recommendations to TPAC** Chair(s) shall work with TPAC administrator to put recommendation items on TPAC regular agenda as appropriate.

CAMPO is researching existing data concerning community attitudinal surveys and what gaps need to be filled with either interim survey(s) or if we can do a larger survey effort in the next couple of years.
