Wake Transit Work Plan - Budget Kick Off Reminders

- This is the starting point for the FY23 Work Plan Process

The FY23 Fiscal Year runs from July 1,2022 – June 30,2023

- Current baseline is modeled in accordance with the Wake Transit Financial Policies and Guidelines, amended in 2021, in accordance with the Transit Governance ILA.
- Revenues are still being determined using trend analysis and the most updated data.
- Includes investments from the Adopted Wake Transit Vision Plan.
- Project requests, updated revenue assumptions, additional refinement from the Greater Triangle Commuter Rail
 Project Update of Alternatives Analysis and further studies and TPAC deliberation will inform FY 2023 Draft Wake
 Transit Work Plan.
- Additional agency, stakeholder, and public comment will then be used to produce FY 2023 Recommended Work Plan.





Expectations of Team Members
