
TPAC Members Survey – Results presented to TPAC on January 12, 2022


* What is your current role with the TPAC?


* 17 of the TPAC's 22 designated primary voting members participated. This is a great response rate.




* How long have you been a TPAC participant?




Any time I don't have to drive somewhere for a meeting is time I can be using for other tasks ²⁰ days ago



On average, our meetings end between 11:15am and 11:30am, but some continue to noon. Over the past year, we have noted a drop in attendance at meetings that go longer than 11:00am. 


- 54% I keep the full 9:30am-12:00pm time slot blocked on my calendar each month.

- 5% I don't feel that the informational items at the end of the agenda need my participation, I read them on the agenda itself.





I feel communication is strong but I am still getting caught up with what different subcommittees roles and responsibilities are and how TPAC fits into that. 20 days ago




I think it would be great to have a basic orientation packet/information sheet for new members to make sure they are up to speed on the processes and procedures.
