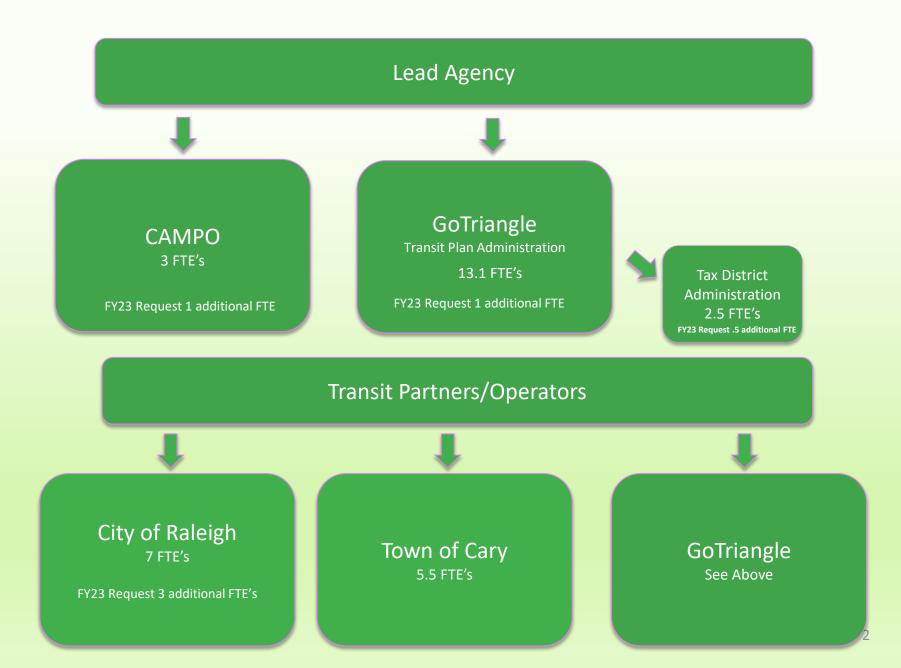

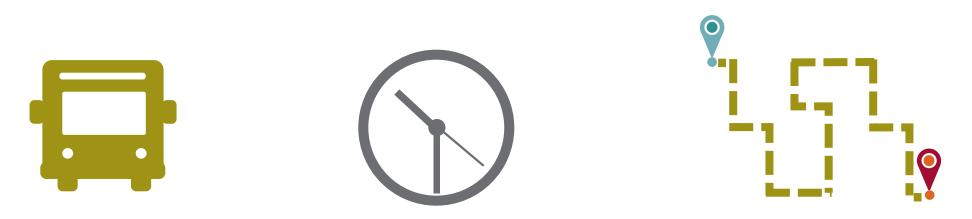

Study Context

- GoTriangle maintenance facility is at capacity
- Transit plans will include expansion service and more buses
- Proactive planning is necessary to ensure facility capacity does not limit ability to deliver service





Goals

- Create additional O&M capacity for fixed-route and demand response service
- Maintain or reduce non-revenue miles
- Improve physical environment for O&M staff
- Adopt achievable plan





Key Findings to Date

- Existing Nelson Road Facility is optimally located for existing and future GoTriangle services
- Design year (2050) fleet size of 120 vehicles warrants a single facility
- Expand and renovate GoTriangle BOMF to accommodate existing and future needs
- Future need to relocate Paratransit maintenance and servicing

Recommended FY2023 Wake Transit Work Plan available for community review

The recommended FY2023 Wake Transit Work Plan is available for community review during a 30-day comment period from April 29 to May 29. A total of \$121.7 million is budgeted in the recommended Work Plan for FY23. It is estimated that \$107.5 million of that total will be collected through the transit-dedicated, half-cent sales tax, with the balance derived from a mixture of other funding sources. Ongoing and completed project studies have provided updated cost and schedule information that planning partners used to evaluate and rebalance the FY23 Work Plan budget, as well as multi-year investment strategies through FY2030.

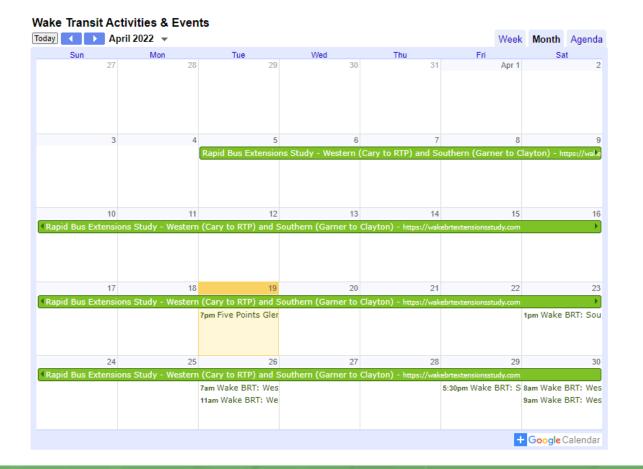
