


# Wake BRT: New Bern Avenue

#### Overview

- Final (90%) design phase
- Ten (10) Stations (19 platforms)
- Seven (7) CNG buses
- Project improvements include green stormwater infrastructure, sidewalk improvements, use path, water and sewar main upgrades

#### **Timeline**

- Spring 2022 90% design
- Spring 2022 Start ROW acquisition
- Fall 2022/Winter 2023 Anticipated start of construction
- Fall 2024/Winter 2025 Anticipated start of service



## Wake BRT: New Bern Avenue

## Wake BRT: New Bern Ave



#### **CONSTRUCTION STARTS FALL 2022**

Wake Bus Rapid Transit (BRT): New Bern Ave will connect downtown Raleigh to WakeMed and New Hope Rd via fast and reliable BRT service. BRT will use dedicated transit lanes and transit signal priority to ensure frequent and on-time-service.

#### IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDE:

- 19 enhanced transit platforms
- · Green stormwater infrastructure
- A multi-use path on the south side of New Bern Ave
- Sidewalk on the northside of New Bern Ave
- Water and sewer main upgrades
- Landscaping
- · Overall improved connectivity

Impacts to downtown within the BRT project limits include a reduction of bike lanes, parking and loading zones.



Wake BRT platform amenities include seating, weather protection, ADA accessible boarding, digital signage with real time arrival information, trash & recycling, off-board ticketing, art and much more!

- Fall 2022 Start Construction
- · Fall 2024 Services Begins

## Wake BRT: Western Corridor

#### **Overview**


- Preliminary design phase
- Approximately 12 miles
- 20 proposed stations
- Downtown Raleigh to Downtown Cary
- Ten (10) CNG buses or other alternatively fueled buses

#### **Timeline**

- January 2021 Began preliminary design
- Fall 2022 10% design
- Fall 2023 Anticipated 30% design
- Fall 2023 Anticipated FTA CIG Small Starts Ratings Submission



# Western Corridor – Parallel Projects



#### **Ongoing Capital Projects**

- Number of ongoing design projects along Western Corridor (COR, NCDOT and Town of Cary)
- Awaiting design decisions related to these projects from project sponsors to accurately develop cost estimates for Western Corridor BRT project

#### **Ongoing Planning Work**

- City of Raleigh currently working on multiple studies/planning initiatives along the corridor. City Council review expected Summer 2022:
  - Western Blvd Corridor Study
  - Western TOD overlay
  - Initiating Station Area Planning


# Wake BRT: Southern Corridor

#### **Overview**

- Preliminary design phase (5%)
- Connecting downtown Raleigh and Purser Drive in Garner
- Approximately 5 miles and up to 10 proposed stations
- Seven (7) CNG or other alternatively fueled buses


#### **Timeline**

- Fall 2021 Began preliminary design
- Spring 2022 5% design
- Summer/Fall 2022 Anticipated 10% design
- Summer/Fall 2022 Anticipated FTA CIG Small Starts Ratings Submission



# FTA CIG Small Starts Ratings

- ✓ Project Development (PD) Acceptance for both Southern and Western Corridors
- Next step: Submit ratings application for each project to determine funding eligibility
  - Projects must be rated at least a "medium" to be considered for future federal funding
- Small Starts Ratings Applications determine federal ask
  - Important to have accurate project cost estimates before the ratings application



# FTA CIG Small Starts Ratings Strategy

#### 1. Wake BRT: Western Corridor Small Starts Ratings in August-September 2023

Coordination needed with capital projects along Western Corridor. Awaiting design decisions
related to these projects from project sponsors to accurately develop cost estimates for
Western Corridor BRT project.

#### 2. Wake BRT: Southern Corridor Small Starts Ratings in August-September 2022

- Less complex design assumptions related to BRT, fewer stations
- Will need to identify a funding source for general purpose lanes along S. Wilmington St Extension. However, funding source **does not** need to be identified before a ratings application.

# Northern Major Investment Study

#### **Study Overview**


- Develop recommendations to connect to North Hills and Triangle Town Center and phasing opportunities for implementation
- Approximate timeframe: 18 months
- Funded by local Wake Transit funds and federal funds
- Contract fee approximately \$500K
- HDR's DBE participation 18%

October 2021	HDR recommended as top-ranked consultant
February 2022	Council authorized CM to execute contract with HDR
March 2022	Northern MIS study begins
End of 2023	Northern MIS study anticipated completion date

# Northern Major Investment Study

#### **Study Area + Alternatives Analysis**

- Connections to North Hills and Triangle Town Center, and investigation of potential connections to Wake Tech
- For potential connection to Wake Tech, question is <u>if</u>
  this would be beneficial connection for a CIG project
  (near or far term) vs. high-frequency local route
- Three (3) step alternatives analysis process:
  - Fatal Flaw vehicle operability
  - Refinement and Screening (Level 1)
  - Detailed Screening (Level 2)



# Northern Major Investment Study

Engagement to include virtual and non-virtual outreach, as well as targeted outreach to include those not typically well represented in the process, such as minorities and low literacy populations

#### **Phase 1: Public Engagement**

Fall 2022 - Refinement & Screening of Alternatives

#### **Phase 2: Public Engagement**

Winter/Spring 2023 - Detailed Screening

#### **Phase 3: Public Engagement**

Spring/Summer 2023 - Recommended Alternatives

# GO FORWARD A COMMUNITY INVESTMENT IN TRANSIT

FY 2023 Work Plan Project Agreement Groupings and Reporting Deliverables

TPAC Meeting May 11,2022

<u>Background</u> - The purpose of the agreements is to guide deliverables for funds appropriated in the Wake Transit major capital and operating funds appropriated by the tax district.

Operating Agreements or Master Agreements- an agreement between an agency tasked to provide an Implementation Element, the Tax District and other agencies as needed, or an operating plan if the Implementation Element is to be provided by the Agency. The agreement shall state the details of the service to be provided and detail expectations on funding, responsibilities, schedule and performance. The agreement shall adhere to minimum standards outlined in Section 8.02 of [the Transit Governance ILA]. Master agreements mean an Operating or Capital Funding agreement that directs a discrete logical grouping of projects, operations or studies.

<u>Capital Funding Agreements or Master Agreements</u> - an agreement between an agency and other agencies to provide an Implementation Element or a project plan if the implementation element is to be provided by the Agency. The agreement or project plan shall state the details of the capital improvements to be provided and detail expectations on funding, responsibilities, schedule and performance and shall adhere to minimum standards outlined in Section 7.01 of [the Governance ILA]. Master agreements mean an Operating or Capital Funding agreement that directs a discrete logical grouping of projects, operations or studies.

#### FY23 Work Plan Project Agreement Examples

- Minimal changes from FY22 agreements (Date / Year)
- Recommended change on all agreements to expire 12/31/XX
  - Allows consistency
    - Changes from 9/30/XX or 12/31/XX to 12/31/XX.

The Agreement shall become effective upon execution by all Parties ("Effective Date"). The term of this Agreement shall be from the Effective Date until December 31, 2023. The Parties may extend the term of this Agreement or may otherwise amend this Agreement as set forth in Section 7.

- Allows for Period of Performance Extensions to occur in Q1 in the near future.
  - True accounting of full year expenditures from the year before.
- Examples of General Capital, General Operating and Special agreements are included as part of Attachment B.
