VIII. Wake Bus Plan Project Prioritization Policy

CAMPO has been tasked with updating the Bus Plan Project Prioritization Policy (PPP) as part of the Wake Bus Plan process led by GoTriangle. The PPP is a critical tool needed to establish each transit provider's short-range transit investment plans which members will hear more about later in this agenda. The purpose of the Wake Bus Plan PPP is to be a decision-making framework that provides: transparent and easily understandable process for making choices between competing investment needs; guidance on the development of the bus service and capital investment plan prepared through the Wake Bus Plan; and an optional process that may be used by the TPAC to adjust bus service and the capital investment program outlined by the Multi-Year Bus Service Implementation Plan (MYBSIP) to reflect changes in available funds, new or substantially modified project requests, or other needs in the region. No changes have been made to the Wake Bus Plan PPP since it was brought to the TPAC as an information item. The PPP was released for public review from November 9th – 23rd. CAMPO staff will review the engagement summary and details of the policy for TPAC consideration.

GoTriangle staff have been leading the Wake Bus Plan update process and will provide the TPAC with a project progress update. GoTriangle staff received feedback from the Wake Transit governing boards and other regional partners on the initial results of the Greater Triangle Commuter Rail (GTCR) Phase 2 Feasibility Study and have worked to address the questions and develop alternatives to meet partner expectations. the revised information out for public comment from January 5th to February 19th. At the December TPAC meeting, staff will present a project progress update including an overview of the alternatives and survey options, a summary of the engagement strategy and draft messaging being developed and next steps that are being planned.

XI. Final FY2022 Wake Transit Progress Report and Financial Audit

GoTriangle staff have worked with Wake Transit partners since late summer to draft and finalize the FY2022 Wake Transit Progress Report. At the last joint meeting, the results of the annual Wake Transit financial audit were not yet released. Since the joint meeting, independent audit procedures were completed on November 29, 2022. The auditor's compliance reports show no findings and have been incorporated into the final FY2022 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report. As a result of the conclusion of the audit, no changes to financial overview of the report have been made since the previous presentation at the joint meeting. GoTriangle staff will present the final FY2022 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and the Wake Transit Progress Report. The TPAC will receive a copy of the final report, which, in accordance with the ILA, is due and will be submitted to CAMPO and Wake County tomorrow, December 15th.
