#### **Reimbursement Approval Process**

Adopted by the Budget and Finance sub-committee in order to:

- Allow staff to focus on Wake Transit Projects
- Limit the request for additional FTE administrative spending

Tax District Administration creates reimbursement template. Templates are reviewed as part of the yearly financial audit for sampling and compliance testing.

#### **Submit Request**

- Providers submit reimbursement templates for actual Wake Transit service delivered
- Financial officer or representative reviews and validates template

#### **Review Request**

- Confirm that progress report showed activity on reimbursement requests
- Confirm that financial officer or representative has reviewed and validated the reimbursement template

The Tax District Administration reviews all Non-Community Funding Area reimbursement templates, except GoTriangle's which are reviewed by CAMPO. <u>CAMPO requests additional detail back-up that</u> other transit partners are not required to submit.



### **Difference of interpretation**

The TPAC recommended and Wake Transit Governing Boards adopted the "Baseline Transit Funding Documentation" that identifies pre-Wake Transit funding baseline for each Provider.

*Currently, there is a difference in Interpretation about whether transit providers are held to a financial baseline or Revenue Hour baseline.* 

This difference of interpretation is preventing the Tax District Administration from distributing Wake Transit funds to all transit providers, who have delivered service according to the adopted FY21 and FY22 Wake Transit Work Plans.

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


#### <u>Wake Transit Work Plan – Budget Kick Off Reminders</u>

- Current baseline is modeled in accordance with the Wake Transit Financial Policies and Guidelines, amended in 2021, in accordance with the Transit Governance ILA.
- Revenues are still being determined using trend analysis and the most updated data.
- Includes investments from the Adopted Wake Transit Vision Plan.
- Project requests, updated revenue assumptions, additional refinement from the Greater Triangle Commuter Rail Project Update of Alternatives Analysis and further studies and TPAC deliberation will inform FY 2024 Draft Wake Transit Work Plan.
- Additional agency, stakeholder, and public comment will then be used to produce FY 2024 Recommended Work Plan.

Federal Reserve Economic Data – Retail Sales (excl. Food)







## **Project Management Update**

- GoTriangle executed a task order with Nelson\Nygaard in June 2021 to complete the Bus Plans and Short Range Transit Plans project scope
  - Funding from Wake, Durham, and Orange county transit plans
  - \$1,016,863 total budget
- Major Deliverables
  - Wake Bus Plan FY25-30 (Operating and Capital)
  - Short Range Transit Plans (GoRaleigh, GoCary, GoTriangle, GoDurham, GoWake ACCESS, GoDurham ACCESS)
  - Wake Bus Plan Project Prioritization Policy
  - Wake Bus Plan Service Standards and Performance Metrics
- The project is expected to be complete in summer 2023
  - Schedule adjustments were made to respond to feedback from partners, stakeholders, and team members about the pace of the project

## Online Survey: 685 Participants








# **Key Findings**

  - 48% of people commute five days a week
- Shopping and recreation are also a major reason for travel
  - Most people travel once a week



### Wake Bus Plan Project Prioritization Policy

The Project Prioritization Policy was first published and approved for use on the Wake Bus Plan in 2018 and is now being updated as a part of the 2022 Wake Bus Plan Update. As such, it will recommend an implementation program that schedules projects for funding up until Fiscal Year (FY) 2030.

The current draft has already undergone several levels of review and comment by the Wake Bus Plan Core Technical Team (CTT).

### Wake Bus Plan Project Prioritization Policy

The Wake Bus Plan Project Prioritization Policy (PPP) is a decision-making framework. It is intended to provide:

- A transparent and easily understandable process for making choices between competing investment needs associated with implementation of the bus service components of the Wake Transit Plan
- Guidance on the development of the 10-year bus service and capital investment plan prepared through the Multi-Year Bus Service Implementation Plan (MYBSIP)
- An optional process that may be used by the TPAC to adjust bus service and the capital investment program outlined by the MYBSIP to reflect changes in available funds, new or substantially modified project requests, or other needs in the region






