A COMMUNITY INVESTMENT IN TRANSIT

- The draft FY2023 Wake Transit Work Plan is available for community review during a 30-day comment period from February 14 to March 16. The draft Work Plan is located online, along with other engagement materials, at: qoforwardnc.org/wakeinput
- The "Four Big Moves" that guide Wake Transit Plan implementation are to: 1. Connect the region; 2. Connect all Wake County communities; 3. Create frequent and reliable urban mobility; 4. Enhance access to transit.
- A total of \$118.1 million is budgeted in the draft Wake Transit Work Plan for FY2023.
- The draft FY2023 Wake Transit Work Plan includes an allocation of \$969,070 for new Community Funding Area Program applications and more than \$1 million to support the operation of Morrisville's new Smart Shuttle service, the Wake Forest Circulator, and Apex Route 1, all of which were partially funded through the CFAP. It is also proposed that GoRaleigh will receive \$670,000 to establish the first portion of Route 9, a new high-frequency bus service along the busy Hillsborough Street corridor through downtown.
- Capital investments included in the draft Work Plan include numerous projects. Those efforts involve the construction of new transit stations, centers, and transfer points; continued improvements to park-and-ride lots and local bus stops; the expansion and construction of system support facilities; the purchase of alternative fuel buses and other support vehicles; and, funding to get the Wake BRT: Southern Corridor through the final design project development phase. These projects will improve service reliability, access to transit, and the rider experience while providing new and enhanced travel options to meet evolving customer needs.
