PLANNING AND PROGRAMMING ITEMS

5. 2035 Wake Transit Plan Update Public Engagement Plan

(Information Item: Stephanie Plancich, CAMPO, 15 minutes) Attachment B

Through the month of February, the consultant team of Nelson-Nygard, Kimley-Horn and P3 have been working with the project management team, and community engagement subcommittee (the engagement side of the project's core technical team). With the input of several Wake Transit partners, the public engagement plan (PEP), attachment B, has been finalized. Stephanie Presented the PEP highlighting the coordination of the 5 engagement phases with the major milestones of the plan update process. She provided an overview of specific methods and tactics being developed for use during Phase 1, which is planned to launch in April. Core deliverables being developed are a "State of the Plan" report, an interactive community survey and a project web page that will be used throughout the 10-24 month planning process. She wrapped up the presentation by discussing next steps and encouraging TPAC members to share the Train-the-Trainer event information with their organization's communications and engagement staff members.

6. FY 2025 Community Funding Area Program Selection Results

(Information item: Suvir Venkatesh, CAMPO, 15 minutes) Attachment C


The Community Funding Area Program Selection Committee met twice during the month of February and has made their final recommendations. CAMPO staff will first provide a brief overview of the program and timeline. Staff will provide a status update on the CFAP Application process and discuss the project submittals, the selection committee review, and the projects that have been recommended for funding to the TPAC.

Six project requests were submitted for CFAP consideration. The Wake Forest Loops project was withdrawn by the Town and two Apex requests were determined to be outside of the scope of the CFAP program at this time. The remaining 3 projects were approved for funding and will be incorporated into the recommended FY25 Work Plan. Suvir provided information on the program's financial health and outlook, as well as much more details on the selection process in the slides archives on the TPAC meetings webpage.

Katie Schwing noted that the Town of Apex agrees with the recommendation made for the FY25 CFAP selection process, but notes that the Town requests that the questions and concerns that arose through the



process be included in the planning pro ess for the updated CFAP Management Plan and Wake Transit Plan updates.

7. FY 2025 Work Plan Update

(Information item: Ben Howell, CAMPO, 5 minutes

The review and comment period for the FY25 Work Plan is underway and will remain active until March 26th. Staff will review the comments as well as process any new or revised funding requests submitted by partners in preparation for the March PD Subcommittee meeting where it is hoped that the members will recommended an FY 2025 Work Plan for TPAC consideration. Ben reminded the TPAC that the draft Work Plan included 2 budget options since at the time it was released for review, a decision had not been made regarding the inclusion of the vehicle rental tax revenues. Over the past few weeks, that issue has been formally identified by CAMPO and GoTriangle as a significant concern and Wake County, per the ILA assigned responsibilities, has called a conference committee together so the three agencies can work toward coming to an agreement on a path forward for the recommended Work Plan.

8. FY 2024 4th Quarter Work Plan Amendment Request

(Information item: Suvir Venkatesh, CAMPO, 5 minutes) Attachment D

Suvir provided an overview of the FY 2024 Q4 Work Plan Amendment Request submitted by GoTriangle. The request is pull \$200,000 from TC002-M, technology reserve budget item to fund an update to the 2019 Regional Technology Integration Plan. It is expected that this total cost will be offset by contributions from the Durham and Orange Transit Plans as they move through their later amendment processes. This request is cost neutral, since the funds are being pulled from a reserve budget already accounted for in the financial model. Suvir pointed out that the public comment period for the Amendment Request opened March 8th and



will conclude on April 5th. The PD Subcommittee will consider the Amendment on March 26th, and the TPAC will consider the Amendment on April 17th. Attachment G includes the summary of the request and the Amendment Request form submitted by GoTriangle.

Shelby Powell asked for clarification on the funding split. She noted that the project cost is \$200,000, and the request to Wake Transit is \$200,000. Where is the cost share? Michelle Peele explained that GoTriangle understands the urgency of this plan update for the partners and the decision was made to put full preliminary cost estimate into this amendment request to ensure that the project can begin as soon as the scope is approved. There are also some additional scope elements being discussed that would be attributable to Wake County so having a larger upfront budget will allow for those elements to be added without requiring another amendment request. The plan is to use the standard 70/20/10 cost share split for the project, and it is likely that at the end of the study process unused funds would be returned to the Wake Fund balance. Again, the purpose of requesting the full \$200,000 is to help the project move forward as quickly as possible.

9. Engagement Updates: Progress on FY25 Work Plan and FY24/Q4 Amendment Strategy

(Information item: R Curtis Hayes, GoTriangle, 15 minutes)

This engagement update will provide Wake Transit partners with progress reports on two community review and public comment periods. The Draft FY 2025 Wake Transit Work Plan and the FY 2024/Q4 Wake Transit Work Plan Amendment Requests. The comment periods operate separately but also run concurrently for about 18 days during their 30-day comment periods. The TPAC received informational updates about the engagement strategies for both efforts during its February 21, 2024 meeting. The CE Subcommittee heard updates on both strategies during its February 22, 2024 meeting. The Draft FY 2025 Wake Transit Work Plan comment period is February 26, 2024-March 26, 2024. The FY 2024 Q4 Wake Transit Work Plan Amendment Requests comment period is March 8, 2024-April 5, 2024.

10. 2023 Triangle Region Transit Origin-Destination Survey Results

(Information item: Alpesh Patel, Cambridge Systematics, 30 minutes) Attachment E

The City of Raleigh led the 2023 Triangle Region Transit Origine-Destination Survey with consultant support from Cambridge Systematics. The project completed in the fall and the local and regional outcomes are now available. The results have also been published online in the ETC Institute's project dashboard,



https://etcinstitute.com/triangle-wake-county-nc-transit-portal/. Alpesh Patel, and Jason Jones tag teamed the presentation to the TPAC. The full presentation is archived on the TPAC meeting webpage. The O&D survey is typically conducted every 5 years.





They shared numerous highlights and statistics garnered through the survey process. One example is that 90% of riders walk to the bus stop and the average time spent walking is 1-5 minutes.

Trip characteristic trends have shifted since the last survey. Much of which is attributed to the impacts of COVID-19. Namely, more people working from home and that transit service across the region has been free as a

result of the pandemic. This has changed travel patterns, time of day people travel and who is traveling. The attachments show specific finding for GoTriangle, GoRaleigh and GoCary services. In addition to an overview of the survey process and findings, the TPAC received a brief tour of the webpage and data contained therein. Stephanie asked if there was a planned training for folks to dive deeper into the web platform. Jason noted that nothing is scheduled at this time, and Alpesh stated that the partners did receive a pretty robust walk through at their last meeting. If TPAC members are interested in more information, let Stephanie know.
