**Summary of TPAC Weighted Voting Input**

<b>Agency</b>	<b>Comment Summary</b>
Town of Morrisville	Prefer weighted voting based on population 1 <sup>st</sup> and with ILA party equal weights 2 <sup>nd</sup> .
Town of Fuquay-Varina	It is defensible and makes sense to tie weighted voting to population but drop to 1 per 25,000. Tying weighted voting to other metrics other than population, such as fixed-route revenue hours, is problematic.
Wake County	Opposed to weighting toward transit providers, and weighted voting should not be used for every vote. Weighting toward transit providers risks putting decisions out of balance with the CAMPO TCC and Executive Board given the structure of those groups.
Town of Cary	Prefers either option of basing weighted voting on population or on population and transit service provision. If transit service provision is used to assign weighted voting, just assign one additional nominal vote for if fixed-route transit service is provided rather than on the magnitude of service provided.
Town of Apex	The TPAC's actions associated with the development of a program management policy and plan for the Community Funding Areas should be excluded from weighted voting. Adding this exclusion would ensure the votes of members representing municipalities identified as part of community funding areas have equal weight in the program specifically addressing their communities.
