

- **Purpose:** To move passengers between communities in the Triangle Region
- Type: Regional passenger rail
- **Triangle Communities Served:** Durham, RTP, Morrisville, Cary, Raleigh, Garner; future expansion to Clayton, Selma, Wake Forest, Apex, and Hillsborough
- Sponsor: GoTriangle
- Frequency: All day, hourly service or better, 19+ weekday round trips

Fast, frequent and reliable service to keep the Triangle moving





- To incentivize stronger partnerships between local governments, Tribal governments, MPOs/RPOs, State DOTs, and non-profit, private, and community partners
- To tackle persistent equitable access and mobility challenges, as well as greenhouse gas emissions reductions
- Applicants must consist of a partnership between two or more eligible agencies

Local Funding for Regional Rail Implementation

Durham and Wake Transit Plans

\$195 million in Durham Transit Plan for regional rail capital cost or another fast, reliable, and regional transit service. Around \$1.2 billion in Wake Transit Plan for regional rail capital cost.
