# **Mobility Coordination Committee (MCC)**

### About

The 2018 updated Raleigh Urbanized Area/Wake County Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan (CPT-HSTP) sets the priorities for investments and initiatives for coordinating human service and public transit efforts throughout the region. The Plan guides funding and service development for transportation projects that support elderly, disabled and low-income individuals in the Raleigh urbanized area. Creating the Mobility Coordination Committee (MCC) was one recommendation from the 2018 Plan. Following feedback from the CAMPO Executive Board in the 2018 Plan was amended to make minor administrative changes including clarifying roles and responsibilities, formalizing a reporting structure for the MCC and amending the timeline for the mobility management program development recommendations.

#### Purpose

The intent of establishing the Mobility Coordination Committee (MCC) was to create the infrastructure and an organization to manage and guide ongoing coordination activities in the urbanized area and to assign this group responsibility for implementing the CPT-HSTP goals and recommendations. Consisting of staff level agency participants, the MCC provides policy recommendations, acts as a sounding board for stakeholders and helps provide oversight while deploying the recommendations outlined in the plan. Recommendations are presented in three implementation tiers; short, medium and longer-term timeframes. (CPT-SHTP, Section 6)

## **Organizational Structure**

The Committee is governed by the CAMPO Executive Board, reporting to the CAMPO Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) (and in some situations, the Wake Transit Planning Advisory Committee (TPAC)). CAMPO staff supports the committee. The MCC has no prescribed authority beyond serving as a coordinative and recommending body for the region. Jurisdictions, transportation providers and other stakeholder work together to implement the goals and to coordinate transportation services in the region.

### **Full MCC Quarterly meetings**

The Mobility Coordination Committee meets quarterly, typically on the third Thursday of the month. Meeting dates, agendas and any other applicable materials are posted on the CAMPO website, MCC page.

#### **Subcommittees**

Three subcommittees serve as working groups to the MCC. Subcommittees typically meet monthly.

1. MCC Administration – CAMPO (Lead)

MCC Administration is responsible for all administrative items affecting the full MCC. The Administration sub-committee/CAMPO maintains the Implementation Schedules, provides updates and recommendations to the CAMPO TCC, TPAC and Executive Board, supports GoRaleigh and the federal Section 5310 Program, assists with policy development and research and maintains the MCC documents

2. ADA Services – GoRaleigh (Lead), GoCary (Support)

The ADA Subcommittee is made up of all regional transit provider agencies both planning, and operations staff and the group is collectively responsible for coordinating and addressing all ADA recommendations outlined in the CPT-HSTP.

3. Community Transportation (Rural) Services – GoWakeAccess (Lead), JCATS (Support) The Community Transportation Subcommittee addresses all goals affecting the coordination of rural human services and public transit. This subcommittee takes the lead on inviting, with full MCC support, other transportation stakeholders from various agencies – human services transportation providers working with the rural areas to participate on the sub-committee to help coordinate services and advance the CPT-HST plan recommendations.
