



Northeast Area Study Update Online Survey #2



Welcome! You may recall that our first round of engagement (May-June) focused on identifying issues, needs and potential strategies. Our project team spent several months reviewing and analyzing data, summarizing feedback, and identifying deficiencies in the transportation network.

Now it's your turn to help us validate the recommendations and help to prioritize (rate or rank) the types of improvements in order to develop a full draft plan for roadway, bicycle, pedestrian, and transit networks.

There are four sections to this survey, which should take no more than five to ten minutes in total to complete. No personally identifiable information will be collected, analyzed, or reported. Your responses will be kept confidential and reported only in the aggregate.

Roadway
