

When streets are resurfaced the City installs bicycle facilities where context and right of way allow.









Dear Mr. Niffenegger:

Thank you for your letter of August 25 requesting approval to use bicycle signal faces for bicycle facilities on a city-wide basis in the City of Raleigh. Your request was made under the provisions of Section 1A.10 in the 2009 edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD) and the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Interim Approval Memorandum (IA-16) dated December 24, 2013.

Your request is approved city-wide, but be aware that you must request and obtain the prior approval of the North Carolina DOT for any location that is on the State highway system.

Please maintain and periodically update a list of all locations where bicycle signal faces are installed in the City of Raleigh. Per Paragraphs 20 and 21 of Section 1A.10, please inform the North Carolina DOT of the locations of such use and please check for any State laws and/or directives covering the application of the MUTCD provisions that might exist in North Carolina.

For recordkeeping purposes, we have assigned your request the following Interim Approval number and title: "A-16.55 – Bicycle Signal Faces – City of Raleigh, North Carolina". Please reference this number in any future correspondence.






### New Bern Avenue Sidewalks

#### **Current Activity**

Updated Jan. 24

The project is scheduled to advertise for construction bids in April 2019.



#### Summary

The project consists of streetscape improvements on both sides of the New Bern Avenue from Tarboro Road to Sunnybrook Road. The scope of work includes two sections, which will be constructed as one comprehensive project:

#### Section 1 (Tarboro Street to Raleigh Blvd) - 0.49 miles

- 14-feet-wide sidewalks (in areas where 14 feet is not feasible due to r/w constraints, sidewalk width will be maximum extent practical)
- · Street trees w/ grates
- · Pedestrian/traffic signalization modifications
- Utility coordination/relocations

#### Section 2 (Raleigh Blvd to Sunnybrook Road) - 1.67 miles

- · Eight-feet-wide sidewalk/multi-use path along both sides of roadway in a greenway style alignment
- Pedestrian/traffic signalization modifications
- · Utility coordination/relocations

#### **Current Activity**

The design team is working through the design of the pedestrian structures and the project permitting. It took more time than expected to work through the analysis of the flood model study. As a result, we had to take a step back and reevaluate the pedestrian bridge stream crossings to eliminate a rise in the flood elevation.

We now have the design approach worked out, however, this requires many levels of review and permitting including City, state, and federal. In addition, staff is working on property acquisition that supports the project alignment and parking areas.

#### **Current Activity**

AECOM is currently designing a trail alignment that will connect the Walnut Creek Trail between Trailwood Drive and NC State University's Centennial Campus. This new trail connection will eliminate the need to utilize the sidewalk along Avent Ferry Road as the greenway connection. The new alignment is expected to follow along the existing sewer easement.




#### **Current Activity**


















Harrington Street Cycletrack
