
#### It is time for the Montgomery County Maternity Fair.

#### What are the symptoms of Cataracts?

Cataracts can start small and subtle, so it's not always evident that a cataract is developing. Over time, you may notice the following symptoms:

- · Faded or yellowed colors
- Reduced night vision
- · Light sensitivity and increased glare
- Halo effect around lights
- Dim, cloudy, or blurry vision
- More frequent glasses prescription changes
- Double vision in a single eye

#### **Cataract Risk Factors**

The main risk factor for cataracts is advancing age, but other factors can make them more likely to develop earlier. These include diabetes, smoking, a family history of cataracts, exposure to UV radiation over time, high blood pressure, previous inflammation or injury to an eye, previous eye surgery, obesity, excessive alcohol consumption, and prolonged use of corticosteroid medication.

#### **MCDH Vaccine Information**


The COVID-19 Vaccine and Booster is available at the Department of Health for all individuals ages 5-11 years old or 18 and older.

## Let's Talk Bacteria

#### What is Salmonella?

Salmonella is a bacterial infection that can make people sick. The illness people get from a Salmonella infection is called salmonellosis.

#### How serious is Salmonella infection?

Most people will recover without treatment. Young children, older adults, and people with weakened immune systems are more likely to have severe illness. Some severe cases can result in hospitalization and, in rare cases, can lead to death.

#### How does Salmonella Spread?

You can get Salmonella infections if you:

- Eat raw or undercooked foods such as meat, poultry, or eggs
- Eat cooked foods that came in contact with contaminated raw food
- Eat foods or drinks contaminated by an infected person
- Are in close contact with a child or adult who has Salmonella
- Come in contact with infected animals or their feces. High risk animals include reptiles, amphibians, and live poultry

### Can Salmonella infection be prevented?

- Eat thoroughly cooked meats, poultry, fish, and eggs.
- Eat only pasteurized milk and dairy products.
- Wash fruits and vegetables.
- Prevent cooked foods from being contaminated by raw foods.
- Wash hands after touching animals/pets, animal feces, or items contaminated with animal feces.
- Don't use food preparation areas to bathe pets or to wash their dishes, cages, or aquariums.
