The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year **2021-2022** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2021**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

* The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council may recommend certain programs for one or two-year funding awards dependent upon program performance, compliance with JCPC policy, and the availability of state JCPC allocation funds.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

- Peer Domain: Montgomery County youth involved with the juvenile justice system are more likely to be rejected by pro-social peers and sometimes associate with others involved in delinquent.
- Individual Domain: Montgomery County youth involved in the juvenile justice system have some substance use or abuse, and have mental health needs being met or that need further assessment. Montgomery County youth are 12 years or older when the first delinquent offense is alleged in a complaint.
- Family Domain: Montgomery County youth have family members who have prior or current involvement in the criminal justice system. Family/Parental Supervision Skills are marginal and/or parental enhancement skills needed for juvenile court referred youth. Access services that provide best practices and have the ability to engage families are needed.
- School Domain: Montgomery County youth involved with the juvenile justice system have increased risk of moderate to serious school behavior issues reflected in prolonged absences from school and suspensions.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
5. Program has demonstrated success working with families with substance abuse and criminal histories.
6. Program has a transportation component.
7. Program has a plan of implementation and schedule for the service delivery.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.

After submitting the application electronically, print and submit TWO hard copies as indicated below. Private non-profits are also required to submit agency's Conflict of Interest Policy, Conflict of Interest Statements, No Over Due Tax forms, and proof of 501(c)(3) status.
