- Child vaccines free of charge to children 0– 18 years old who are uninsured, underinsured, Native American, Native Alaskan, or who receive Medicaid
- Adult vaccines against Covid, Influenza, Hepatitis B and Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Whooping Cough (TDAP). There is a fee for most adult vaccinations
