

Admission of Inmate

800.1 IDENTITY OF ESCORTING OFFICER AND INMATE

To prevent the improper confinement of an individual in the Montgomery County Detention Center, members will be required to verify the identity of all escorting officers, and to the extent possible all inmates prior to admitting anyone for confinement at the facility.

800.2 CONDITION OF INMATE UPON ADMISSION

Detention officers will not accept custody of any inmate who appears to be in need of immediate medical care due to either injury or illness. Detention officers will request escorting officers to transport such inmates to a local hospital for treatment. Intoxicated persons; who do not appear to be in need of immediate medical treatment, may be admitted into the facility by detention officers as long as their BAC is 0.24 or less.

800.3 LEGALITY OF COMMITMENT

To prevent the wrongful confinement of an individual, Booking Officer will not accept custody of any person without documented legal authority to do so. Documentation will be filed in the inmate's record by the Booking Officer.

800.4 INMATE COMMUNICATION WITH ATTORNEYS AND OTHERS

In accordance with state law and federal recommendations, Montgomery County detention officers will provide each newly admitted inmate with a reasonable opportunity to utilize and access a telephone to contact an attorney(s), family member(s), friend(s) and/or others and advise them of their confinement. Detention officers will also grant inmates the opportunity to have a visit with an attorney should the inmate or attorney request the same.
