Diagnosis in 16 Years: A Woman's Health, Public Health Crisis


Live Webinar Thursday, May 19, 2016 12:00 PM - 1:00 PM EDT

Hot Topic: Adolescent Thrombosis

Adolescent venous thromboembolism (VTE), or the clot formation in blood vessels in adolescents, is a serious condition that requires prompt recognition and optimal management to prevent mortality and long-term morbidity. Over the past 15 years, thromboembolic events (TEs) and the underlying inherited and acquired thrombophilic conditions have been increasingly recognized in teens at risk, with combined hormonal contraception constituting one of the most significant of these risk factors.



In an effort to provide education to providers on the recognition of thrombogenic risk factors for clot prevention and management, FWGBD hosted the following live webinar. We encourage you to view this important program, and to share it with a colleague or group who might also benefit from its information.

Webinar: Adolescent Thrombosis: Etiology, Prophylaxis and the Role of Hormonal Therapy

This Webinar will provide evidence-based, practical information on the complications of thromboembolism among female adolescents. It will also review the prevalence and presentation of risk factors predisposing adolescents to VTE and discuss prophylactic strategies. In particular, it will review the modern risk factor of increased screen time/reduced physical activity among adolescents and its relation to VTE. Lastly, it will inform medical providers on the role of hormonal therapy and the importance of a collaborative management by hematology and gynecology for thrombosis, thrombophilia and hormonal therapy in adolescent females. It originally aired on May 2, 2016.

Canadian Health & Family von Willebrand Disease: Spreading Awareness



The key to preserving a high quality of life for patients with von Willebrand disease often begins with identifying its presence.

According to FWGBD Medical Advisory Committee member, Paula James, MD, of Queen's University, a diagnosis can be a positive thing, and recognition of the disease is often accompanied with optimism. "I'm always pleased when I make a new diagnosis of von Willebrand disease because we have so many effective treatments to offer patients."

Amongst James' primary goals as a hematologist, she emphasizes the importance of spreading awareness. To reach that goal, she and Canadian Health & Family have created a special program that utilizes, among other methods, two educational videos that may be shared with colleagues and patients.
