Funding to support the GRCC's work in economic development, public policy, regional leadership, government affairs, advocacy, and equitable economic development.



# WHAT'S NEXT? CRITICAL CHALLENGES BRING NEW OPPORTUNITIES

There are critical challenges facing Wake County and the Research Triangle region. If not addressed, they will constrain growth and dampen the region's trajectory. EDGE 7 will support a comprehensive response to these challenges and ensure Wake County is a future-ready community prepared and poised to capitalize on economic opportunities.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

As one of the fastest growing metros in the country, we must be aggressive in our pursuit of smart and sustainable growth. Addressing every aspect of infrastructure across Wake County is critical amid the increasing pressures from the pace of our demographic growth. The key to success in moving the needle on these challenges is a policy and regulatory framework that supports smart growth, not stymes it.

To address this challenge, EDGE 7 will convene an Infrastructure Task Force to complete Wake County's first Comprehensive Infrastructure Plan.

#### DEVELOPMENT OF AN ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRIAL ECOSYSTEM

As Bruce Katz, one of the leading commentators on regional collaboration notes, "by all accounts, the U.S. economy is undergoing an industrial transformation of monumental proportions." Katz describes this transformation as the new Advanced Technology Industrial Ecosystem. These ecosystems are reliant on metro regions building comprehensive, collaborative networks necessary to support their growth. Those metros that can, will thrive.

**EDGE 7** will ensure radical collaboration across the region on critical issues and areas of focus including economic development, marketing, and public policy. The strategy calls for convening an array of public, private, academic, and nonprofit leaders to identify and address challenges.

#### **ECONOMIC MOBILITY & OPPORTUNITY**

Prosperity and opportunity in our community must be available to all. Providing multiple pathways to success and economic opportunity must be the priority of our economic mobility efforts. Focusing on existing industries, the talent pipeline, equitable economic development, and workforce development are crucial.

**EDGE 7** will ensure existing industry and equitable economic development strategies are in place to create the most inclusive, vibrant business environment in the nation.

## **MANAGING SUCCESS**

Wake County and the Research Triangle are among a very small cohort of the most successful metro regions in the nation. A focus on our fundamentals is necessary to ensure we are ready to take the next step as a community. This means supporting existing companies, investing in our education ecosystem, nurturing innovation and entrepreneurship, and staying ahead of infrastructure challenges. What we do with this opportunity is what matters now.

EDGE 7 will support the growth of existing companies through collaboration with Wake County municipalities, Wake Tech, Capital Area Workforce Development, other workforce and education providers, and private sector EDGE investors.

# FIVE-YEAR COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY

The 2024-2029 comprehensive economic development strategy comprises 5 Pillars for Building a Competitive Future. There are evergreen components of any economic development plan including site development, business retention and expansion, talent pipeline, and marketing. However, while many are ongoing, the EDGE 7 plan has new strategies and tactics to address the ever-changing challenges confronting the community.

## PILLAR 1: COMPREHENSIVE INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

Ensure Wake County and the region are future-ready and prepared to capitalize on economic opportunities while avoiding being ill-prepared for growth.

## **Strategies and Tactics**

- NEW Infrastructure Development Convene an Infrastructure Task Force composed of public sector partners, utility providers, and private sector EDGE investors.
  - ► Complete Wake County's first **Comprehensive Infrastructure Plan** to determine Wake County's current and projected infrastructure capacity and demand.
- 2. Site Identification & Readiness Collaborate with all twelve Wake County municipalities, Wake County, utility providers, and private sector EDGE investors to prepare sites for industrial development.
  - NEW Lead the implementation of a county-wide Building and Site Redevelopment Study to identify redevelopment opportunities for industrial development.
  - Convene a Site Identification and Readiness Task Force comprised of private sector EDGE investors, utilities, and public sector partners.
  - ► Collaborate with all twelve Wake County municipalities, Wake County, and private sector EDGE investors of the Site Identification and Readiness Task Force to identify new sites for industrial development.
- 3. **NEW** Business-Ready Policies Lead the creation of a regional Public Policy Agenda to ensure Wake County and the Research Triangle Region have a high quality of life, leading education ecosystem, and strong business climate.
  - Advocate for targeted public policies at the local, county, and state level.

Infrastructure may be the most important challenge for our community to address over the next five years. I support EDGE 7 so the Chamber can serve as the convener, bringing the right partners together to find solutions to ensure we are ready for the future.

Create the most successful advanced technology industrial ecosystem in the nation by attracting new highquality jobs and capital investment and supporting the continued growth of targeted sectors.

#### **Strategies and Tactics**

- 1. Industry Cluster Strategies Support the Advanced Technology Industrial Ecosystem by aiding continued development the target sectors of:
  - Life Sciences
  - Technology
  - ▶ High-Skill, High-tech Advanced Manufacturing
- Clean Tech
- Professional Services & Headquarters
- 2. Job Creation & Investment Increase economic prosperity by recruiting new businesses, jobs, and capital investment.
  - Collaborate with Wake County, Wake County municipalities, workforce development and education partners, utility providers, and private sector EDGE investors to recruit new businesses to Wake County.
- 3. Existing Industry Support Support the growth of existing companies with an emphasis on widely shared economic opportunity.
  - ► Collaborate with Wake County municipalities, workforce development and education providers, and private sector EDGE investors on existing industry visits.
- 4. Economic Mobility Lead equitable economic development efforts to create the most inclusive business environment in the nation.
  - Support the growth of small, minority businesses through a variety of equitable economic development programs.
  - ▶ Lead the continued implementation of the Blueprint to Dismantle Systemic Racism.
- 5. **NEW** Lead Generation Strategy Lead a robust site selection consultant cultivation and business development strategy.
  - NEW Host in-market site selection consultant visits in collaboration with the Research Triangle Regional Partnership, education and workforce development providers, and private sector EDGE investors.
  - Participate in key site selection consultant events to discuss the competitive advantages of Wake County directly with consultants.
  - Send the Site Selection Consultant newsletter every six weeks to 250+ site selection consultants to provide regular updates on Wake County's competitive advantages, rankings, and highlight new industrial and office development of private sector EDGE investors.
- 6. Innovation & Entrepreneurship Collaborate with private sector EDGE investors and other partners to support the growth of the Innovation & Startup ecosystem.
  - ► Convene the Innovation & Entrepreneurship Task Force composed of private sector EDGE investors and a wide array of leaders in the startup ecosystem.
  - Convene the Annual Innovate Raleigh Summit to celebrate the success of the local startup community.

## PILLAR 3: TALENT RECRUITMENT & WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS

Increase the number of highly skilled employees for existing and new companies in Wake County and the Research Triangle Region.

#### **Strategies and Tactics**

- 1. **NEW** Talent Recruitment Expand the national talent recruitment campaign—Work in the Triangle—to market to a broader array of metros.
  - ▶ Position Wake County and Research Triangle region as a primary destination for highly-skilled talent.
  - NEW Expand the Work in the Triangle talent recruitment campaign to five additional metros for a total of 25 target metros.
- 2. **NEW** Local Talent Supply Development Lead the Regional Skills Analysis Survey to capture the critical skill needs of regional businesses.
  - NEW Lead the fourth version of the Regional Skills Analysis Survey in 2026 to get 1,000+ responses from targeted industry sectors.
  - ► Collaborate with public sector, education, workforce development, and key industry stakeholders in the development and completion of the survey.
  - Convene education, workforce development, and key industry stakeholders to review the analysis and determine specific implementation strategies to support businesses and workers based on the new findings.
- 3. **NEW** Constraints on Talent Supply Address key issues that could negatively impact the talent supply such as housing, childcare, transportation, community culture, and amenities.

#### PILLAR 4: MARKETING & GLOBAL BRAND AWARENESS

Communicate Wake County's competitive advantages to prospective businesses and executives through strategic marketing initiatives.

## **Strategies and Tactics**

- 1. **NEW** National Marketing Campaign Lead a new aggressive national business recruitment marketing campaign. The campaign will consist of:
  - ▶ **NEW** A national media and PR campaign to place articles and interviews from Wake County companies and EDGE investors in key industry and news publications;
  - Digital advertising that will target key U.S. metros;
  - Digital ads focused on key business recruitment targets.
- 2. Trade Shows and Missions Lead trade show marketing and participation efforts in key industry sectors.

#### **Strategies and Tactics**

- 1. Radical Collaboration Convene regular meetings of regional public and private sector leaders across the education, workforce, economic development, infrastructure, and transportation sectors. These include:
  - Raleigh Leadership Roundtable
  - Research Triangle Regional Roundtable
  - Raleigh Downtown Roundtable
- Wake County Economic Development Partners Meeting
- NEW Regional Public Policy Task Force
- 2. Regional Marketing & Branding Promote the Research Triangle Region as a center for innovation, economic prosperity, job growth, and capital investment.
  - Provide twenty-five percent (25%) of all private sector EDGE 7 investment to support the efforts of the Research Triangle Regional Partnership.
- 3. Cutting Edge Issues Convene the Business Sustainability Roundtable.
  - Convene public sector, utility providers, and private sector EDGE investors to discuss critical sustainability issues.
  - ► Coordinate with the Business Sustainability Roundtable partners to distribute information, analysis, and best practices to businesses throughout Wake County and the Research Triangle Region.
