# A FRESH LOOK AT IFC PROGRAMS

## TRANSFORMING YOUR DONATIONS INTO JUST RESPONSES TO COMMUNITY NEED

Reflecting our value of social justice, IFC meets immediate community need, while working to change the systems that produce poverty and socioeconomic disparity. Your gifts make this community more affordable for people who make Chapel Hill-Carrboro a diverse and desirable place to live.

Most of you are familiar with many IFC programs, but we want to highlight for you our recent and exciting **Advocacy for Equity** initiatives. You can also be proud of best practices that staff and volunteers have been incorporating into our **Shelter and Housing** and **Community Services** programs.

IFC residents and members include families with unexpected bills, men and women between jobs, people with disability income, and retirees on a fixed income. People return to the community from prison or from hospital stays through IFC. Members and residents work in essential roles as childcare and home-health providers, construction crew members, cashiers and baggers, administrators in local businesses, restaurant servers, car detailers, janitors and landscapers, university and school system employees, and more.

## ADVOCACY FOR EQUITY PROGRAMS

People experiencing poverty, who are disproportionately people of color, generally have little time or energy to spend outside of meeting their basic needs. Unless people in power and with resources hold space for low-income folks in our public life, this perpetuates an unfair lack of representation in our democracy and skews perception of community need.

*IFC's goal: Stand with low-income residents and workers as they raise their voices in public forums and within IFC regarding their lived experience and priorities – like increasing affordable housing opportunities.*

### Meeting of the Minds

A group of low-income community leaders and residents that meets regularly at Community Empowerment Fund to discuss issues that prevent full participation in community life. The people experiencing a problem are best equipped to lead us to a solution, so IFC defers to Meeting of the Minds' advocacy priorities and adopts them as our own: increasing affordable housing for people making up to 30 percent of area median income, making public transit more accessible, and increasing living wage jobs.

### Activate! IFC

A civic engagement and leadership development project with the goal of amplifying the voices of IFC members and residents and increasing representation of low-income people in the political process. Until election day in November 2020, IFC will train volunteers and register voters, learn from community leaders about the local political process, and get out the vote.

### Racial Equity Team

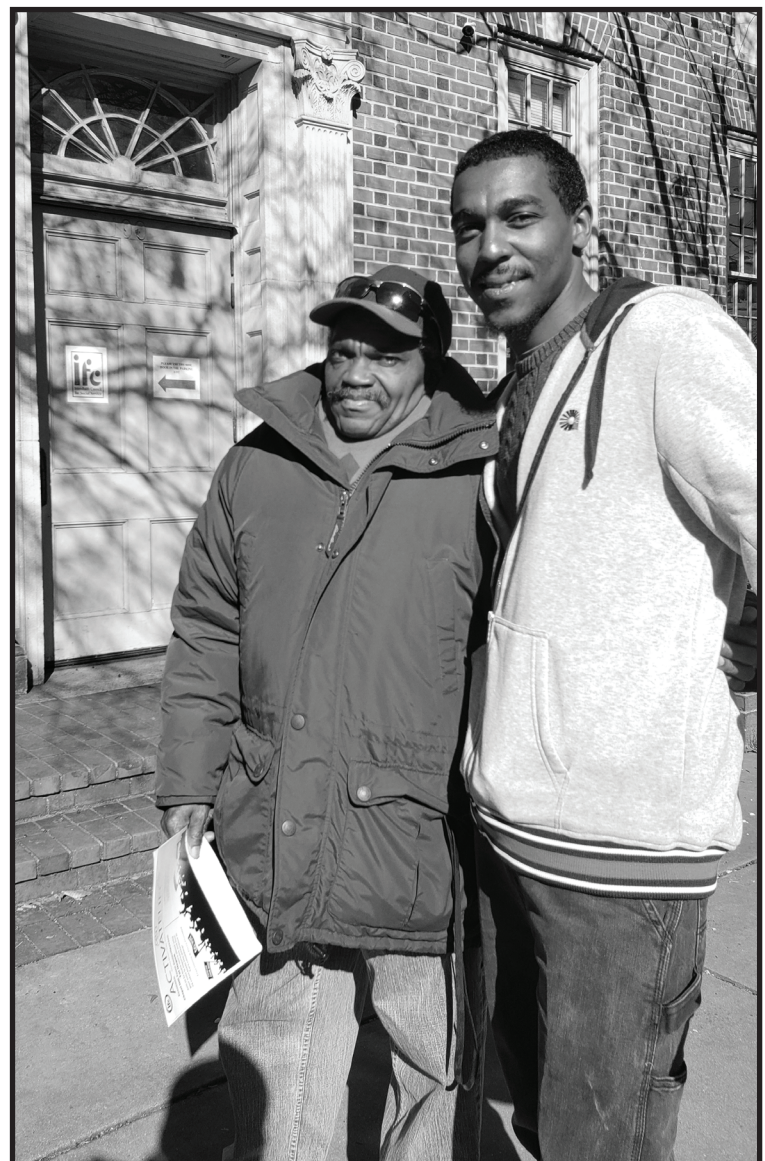
Staff, volunteer, members, residents and board members meet regularly to self-assess and advance equity with IFC's programs.

## SHELTER AND HOUSING

Nearly 1,100 households will be evicted in Orange County in a given year, and 30-40 people sleep unsheltered every night.

*IFC's goal: Facilitate access to permanent housing for people experiencing homelessness, while honoring their right to make choices about how to live their lives and work toward their goals.*

The only shelters in Orange County for people experiencing homelessness, Community House and HomeStart are open 24/7 and house 52 men, 14 women and 10 families. IFC also opens 20 cots to overnight guests during cold weather. While residents wait for affordable housing opportunities to open, they can work with staff who connect them with resources that will help them maintain housing like income, transportation, medical or mental health care, or childcare. The shelters include an on-site health clinic run by Piedmont Health Services, libraries, a playground for children, and gym equipment for adults.

Best practices include: housing-focused case management, trauma-informed, emergency shelter

### Housing Support

IFC administers rent subsidies and provides case management for residents to support their occupancy in permanent housing. Permanent Supportive Housing is a federal program for the county's most vulnerable residents. Master-Lease subsidies are funded by the Town of Chapel Hill.

Best practices include: housing-first, trauma-informed, public-private partnership

In Orange County 29 percent of households (15,766) are cost-burdened, spending more than 30 percent of their income on housing and utilities. This leaves little to sustain through a crisis or to meet basic needs for food, clothing, transportation, essential medications, school supplies.

*IFC's goal: Prevent the instability of housing loss by increasing a family's financial flexibility.*

### Food Pantry

The largest pantry in the county with broadest eligibility requirements. Members may shop for pantry staples, fresh foods and hygiene items as often as once a month. Households choose the foods most appropriate for their families and receive about a week's worth of groceries.

Best practices include: member-choice, walk-in and scheduled appointments, access to fresh food, Spanish-language materials

### Community Kitchen

Co-located with the Food Pantry, the Community Kitchen is open 365 days a year so that nobody has to go hungry. Approximately 50 volunteer groups rotate to serve lunch every day and dinner every week day. Like the Pantry, nearly all of the food is donated.

Best practices include: low barrier - no questions asked and no sign-in required

### Emergency Financial Assistance

IFC schedules 12 appointments every week for people seeking financial assistance to apply toward rent, utilities and other essential needs. Members are eligible to receive up to \$200 once every 12 months.

Best practices include: public-private partnership, housing loss prevention

## From the Executive Director Looking ahead: Sustainability at IFC

---



Dear friends and advocates,

Later this year, IFC's Food Pantry, Community Kitchen, Housing Support, Advocacy for Equity programs, and offices will move into our dignified, new building in Carrboro. When construction is complete, it will be the first time in 57 years that IFC is operating all programs out of our own permanent spaces.

Your financial contributions, plus thousands of volunteer hours and donated goods, all work together to make this community more affordable for residents and workers who struggle to make ends meet. Sustaining this work is critical, because people in crisis depend upon IFC and don't have anywhere else to turn.

Because operating costs have risen steadily in the past five years, and we are moving out of space that the Town of Chapel Hill has subsidized for the last 30, **IFC will require additional commitments of dependable, annual support to sustain our mission and programs into the future.** It will now take about \$2.7 million every year to maintain social safety net services for our neighbors, colleagues and friends.

In order to continue supporting our community, we need more support from you. If you are able, we hope you will consider increasing your commitment to IFC in the coming year.

Together, we:

- Operate two 24-hour shelters that house 90+ adults and children every night.
- Support 22 more residents in permanent housing across the county.
- Open Community Kitchen every day to serve 55,000 nutritious, balanced meals a year.
- Reach 3,500 people with groceries and emergency financial assistance, freeing up about \$450,000 for low-income households to spend on other basic needs: clothing, school supplies, essential medication or medical supplies, transportation, rent and utilities.
- Hold space for low-income leaders, who call our community to be better by being just.

Staff and board leadership are talking to government partners about shared priorities and increased funding potential for basic needs services. We also know that you will help us rise to the challenge, because this community takes care of each other.

If you're looking to be more involved, **now is the time.** If you weren't sure whether a monthly donation would make a difference, know that **every dollar counts.** If you know someone who would be just as excited as you are about where IFC is headed, **let's get together!** We are dedicated to employing best practices to confront and respond to the causes of poverty. Thank you for advancing this work with us.

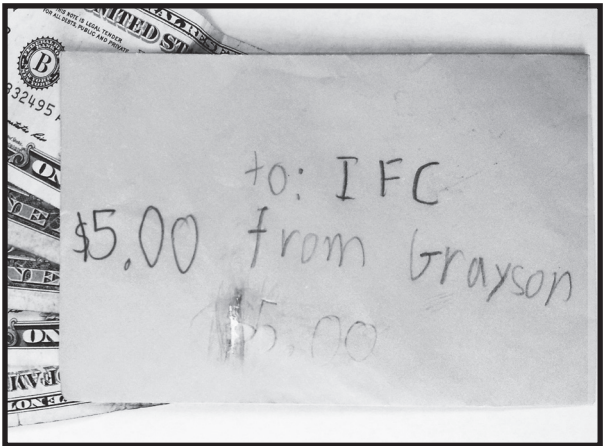

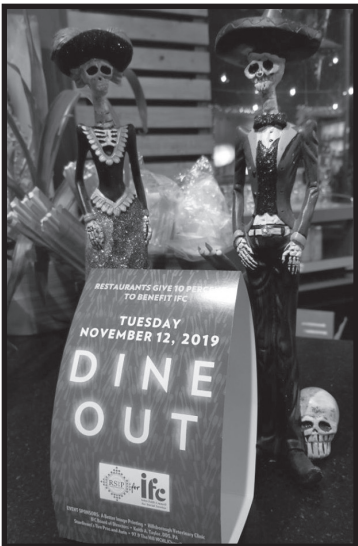
