

Direction of Ohio

At this time would you generally say that Ohio is going in the right direction or has it gotten off onto the wrong track?





This public opinion research data was gathered through a combination of live telephone interviews and secure SMS/text-to-web surveys conducted with 624 adults registered to vote in Ohio who had valid residential, VOIP or cellular telephone numbers. The interviews and surveys were completed during the period of February 7, 2024 through February 13, 2024. The overall estimated margin of sampling error is +/- 3.92 percent, based on a confidence level of 95 percent, although it varies for each individual question. This means that if this survey were repeated, 95 times out of 100 the results would be within plus or minus 3.92 percent of those provided herein. Some adjustments were made to weight the results toward estimates of demographic and geographic characteristics of the state's electorate, in order to account for under- and over-sampling that normally occurs as a result of the random selection process, and to ensure that all major sub-groups are represented in proportion to their actual percentages. Like all polls, this opinion survey research is subject to other possible sources of error, such as unintentional bias in the wording of questions, data-entry error and nonresponse bias.
